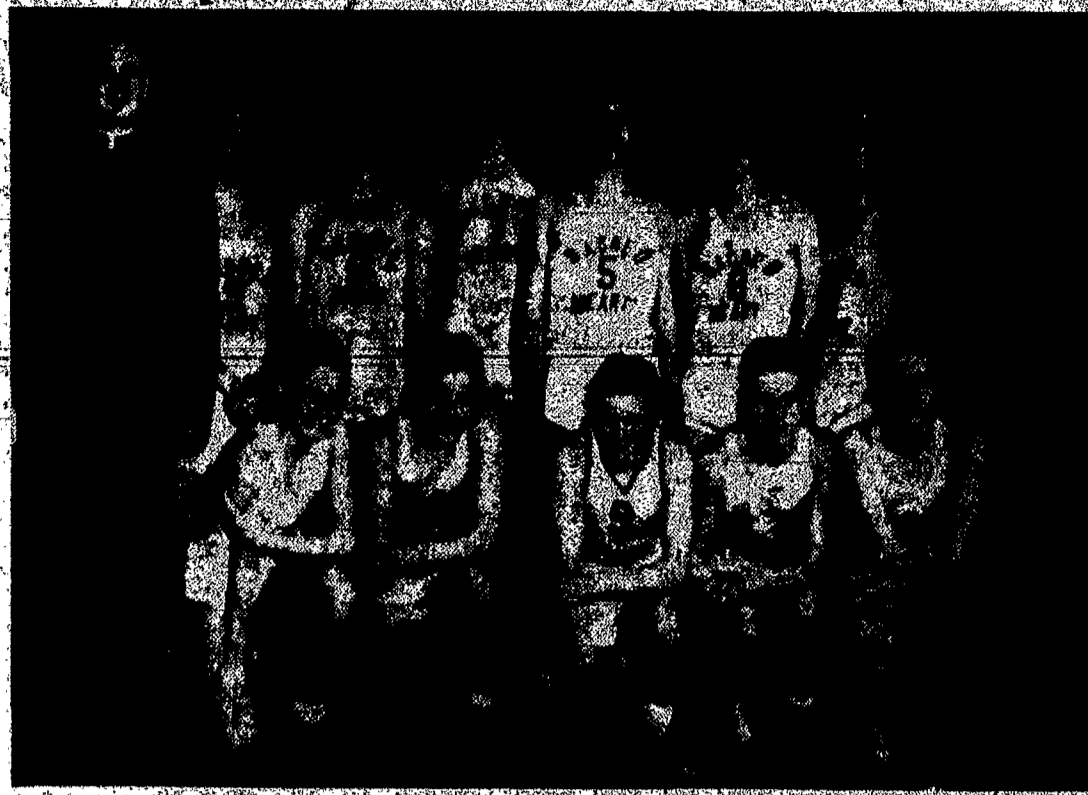

Tiny Tot Swim Class Planned

A new learn-to-swim class, stressing water adjustment and floating for young boys and girls, ages 3-5, will begin on April 23 at 3 p.m. in the Catholic Youth Organization pool, 50 Chestnut St. A unique feature of this class is that mothers will be encouraged to go into the water with their own youngsters to help build confidence and promote a feeling of security in tots who will be exposed to swimming for the first time.

Mothers will be instructed in the first essentials of swimming and water adjustment and will actually play a major part in the teaching of the children. The class will run for eight weeks, ending on June 1 and a free trial lesson will be given new pupils.

Easter Vacation Warning Issued School Children By Safety Officers

An Easter holiday warning to Rochester's boys and girls is issued by the School Safety Officers, Sgt. Jerry Moynihan, Sgt. Willard Boehm and Officer Eugene Redmond.

Points for parents to stress and children to heed are:

- Cross streets only at corners, crosswalks, and where traffic lights are in operation. These rules are necessary for your safety in traffic, no matter where you are going, or what you are doing.
- Many of you will take your bicycles out on the street for the first time this year. Obey all traffic rules when riding your bicycles.
- Ride on the right hand side of the street or roadway.
- Ride in single file when in a group.
- Ride in a straight line in traffic.
- Have a horn or bell that works.
- When turning, always look back over your left shoulder, and point in the direction you intend to go.
- Watch for cars "pulling out" from parking places.
- Give pedestrians the right of way.
- Never carry another person on your bicycle.
- Do not play in the street; remember the streets are for automobiles, trucks, buses, and other vehicles. Go to the playground nearest your home, and use care and caution on the way.
