Equipment Contracts Awarded For New N.D. High In Elmira

With general construction of the new Notre Dame de Lourdes High School on Lower Maple Ave., Elmira "practically completed," Architect Leo Considine of Haskell, Considine and Haskell, announced awarding of eight contracts to supply the major share of equipment and furnishings.

To be installed this summer in time for the new Catholic high school's fall opening will be furniture, auditorium and gymnasium seats and many other items. CONTRACTS already awarded as announced by Architect Considine follow:

1. P & M Office Equipment Co. of Elmira, to supply students individual desks and chairs of solid maple, teachers chairs, tablet arm chairs for study halls and the audio-visual and music departments, and cafeteria tables and chairs.
2. The American Seating Co. of Syracuse, 3,000 metal and upholstered seats for the auditorium.
3. Edgcomb Furniture Co. of Elmira, carpeting for the auditorium.
4. Hoffend Stage Equipment Co. of Rochester, drapes for the auditorium stage.
5. Kewanee Manufacturing Co. of Wisconsin, laboratory equipment for the chemistry and physics laboratories and the general science and biology quarters.
6. P & M Office Equipment Co. of Elmira, library equipment.
7. School Equipment Co. of Syracuse, home economics room equipment for cooking and sewing classes.
8. MacGrevey's of Elmira, office counter.

No figures were announced on the cost of the various items. CONSIDINE LISTED the following facilities for which estimates have been received and will soon be opened:

Folding bleachers for the gymnasium with a capacity of 1,500; basketball backboard structures; electric scoreboard; steel lockers and benches; typewriter desks; arm room tables; teachers desks; shelving for storage areas; stands for the band and choral room, and cafeteria kitchen equipment.

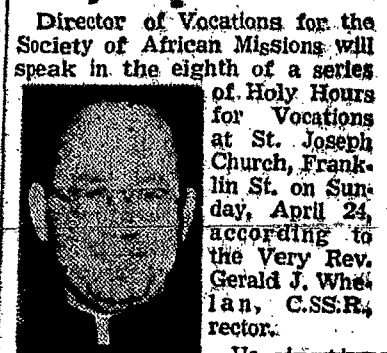
The architect said equipment for the administrative offices will probably be purchased from local suppliers. Meanwhile, general construction of the new school is "practically completed," Considine reported. Work is being finished on the gymnasium floor and electrical installations are in the final stages. Interior painting, plumbing, for work and other phases of the contract have been completed.

Late this month bids will be received for yard improvement work, which will include seeding and planting of grass and shrubbery and laying of sidewalks and driveways.

Contractors also are making rapid progress on remodeling the former Thomas McCann home, adjacent to the school, which will be the convent for Sisters of Mercy.

An addition is being built on the rear of the home and the interior is being modernized.

Eighteen mission stations in Africa are located in various sections of the Dark Continent. Since the society's foundation 750,000 converts were won through the prayers and works of the missionaries.

The society reports more than 1200 priests at work in Nigeria, Liberia, the Gold Coast and other parts of Africa.

Services of the Holy Hour which are conducted from 7 to 8 p.m. are open to parents and their young people throughout the Rochester and suburban areas.
