250 Attend Newman Clubs State Sessions

Attracting some 250 delegates and moderators, the annual convention of the Empire State Province of the National Newman Club Federation held at the University of Rochester, April 22, 23 and 24 explored the theme "The Catholic Student in the Modern World," on the Saturday program.

Students from 46 campuses in the area were present for the sessions brought to a close at a breakfast in Cutler Union on the University campus, Sunday. His Excellency Bishop Kearney, former episcopal chairman for the national Newman Clubs celebrated Mass at 9 a.m. in St. Mary Church for the students.

Speaker at the breakfast was the Rev. Raymond J. Ash of the University of Buffalo Newman Club.

FIRST SESSION of the convention was held Saturday morning on the University of Rochester Prince St. campus following Mass at St. Mary Church.

The delegates who are students at non-sectarian colleges heard the key-note address by His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey. Also on the speaking program which was opened by Fred Spong, convention chairman and president of the UR Newman Club were: the Rev. L. John Hedges, chaplain of the UR Newman Club; the Rev. George Phillips of Onondaga State Teachers College and Dr. Henry C. Mills.

Participating in Saturday's discussion groups was the Rt. Rev. Abbot Gerard McGinley, O.C.S.O. of Our Lady of the Genesee Monastery, Pliffard. He discussed a Trappist's role in the church.

The first section of the discussion group was split into three categories. The Newmanites took part in sessions on marriage and the family led by Dr. Williams L. Madden; misconceptions of college students toward the Church, the Rev. William J. Schifferli, leading and Abbot McGinley's session.

Late morning sessions and their leaders were: Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, "Jo Seida"; programming, William Guilfoyle; fundamental purpose of the Newman Club, James Galza; finance, Robert Craythorn; what the Newman Club can do to increase the spiritual life, Hal Sweeney; alumni relations, Robert Ginecki; and a session for chaplains title, "The
