## Parish Center Results From Crowded School

This September the former convent of Sacred Heart Cathedral located at Lake and Clay Avenues will be converted into a parish center. Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, Cathedral Rector, announced to the people last Sunday that the crowded condition of Sacred Heart School necessitated this move.

In eight years, the registration has increased from 673 to 1186 pupils, making the Flower City Park school the largest in the diocese. This September the enrollment will exceed 1275 pupils, an increase of almost one hundred percent in nine years.

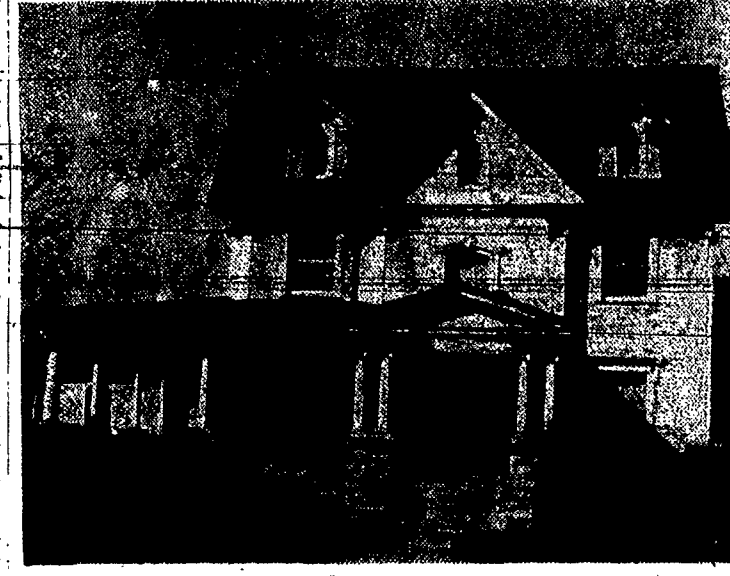
The new addition to Sacred Heart School was completed early in 1952. The hall in that section was turned into two classrooms last summer. It is expected that the remaining two meeting rooms in the new addition will be converted into a classroom this summer.

Existing facilities in the old section of the school cannot accommodate public school released-time religion classes, Scout activities, Inquiry Classes for Catholics and Non-Catholics, and committee meetings of the various parish organizations.

When the Jesuit Fathers of McQuaid Jesuit High School vacate the old convent premises in June for permanent quarters at their new school, it is planned to convert the large basement of the new parish center into two meeting rooms for the 280 Girl Scouts enrolled in the 7 parish troops. The garage will be converted into a Boy Scout room.

The first floor of the center will be used for the released-time program, committee meetings and Inquiry Classes. The hall in Sacred Heart School will continue to be used for meetings of the Men's Club, Rosary Guild, St. John Fisher Club, Sodality, Cub Pack, and for parish dinners and parties.

## First Yearbook Released By College, Title Symbolizes Dedication To Saint

The first yearbook of St. John Fisher College was presented to His Excellency Bishop Kearney on Tuesday, April 26, by John A. Pietropoli, editor-in-chief. Symbolizing the dedication of the college to St. John Fisher, the year book is called "Jo Roffe" from the abbreviation of the cardinal-martyr of Rochester, England, Francis Toner, submitted the name for the yearbook. Pietropoli, who holds the Rosina O'Doherty Kearney Scholarship, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Pietropoli of 151 Scottsville Road.

The editorial staff consists of: Andrew M. Vergo, managing editor; Richard G. Knox, associate editor; Donald L. Muench, photographic editor, and Francis J. Pilecki, editorial advisor. Faculty advisor is Miss Cathryn Zelds Lyons, M.A., registrar at the college.

THE YEARBOOK is dedicated to Bishop Kearney, founder and chancellor of the college.

With the history of the college and its pioneer class as the principal theme, "Jo Roffe" recalls the principal events in the establishment of the first Catholic college for men in the diocese of Rochester and crystallizes them in a chronological sequence.

Also included in the book is the evolution of the elaborate student activities program, a tribute to the leadership and organizing abilities of the students who administer this program.

Climax of the story is the history of a senior class of 59 men who persevered through four of the most tedious, yet vividly memorable years of Catholic college life to become its first alumni and thus bring to fruition the dream

of the loving founder of their Alma Mater, His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

The yearbook was published and printed by the Christopher Press, 35 Sco St., Rochester.

According to a letter received from KAUN, the winning paper will go to the National Contest for judging.

Along with an interest in sociality, school dances, and Youth club activities, including direction of entertainment for Nazareth Day at the Ganest Barr, Mary Ellen keeps up a high scholastic record. She holds tenth place in a class of 285.

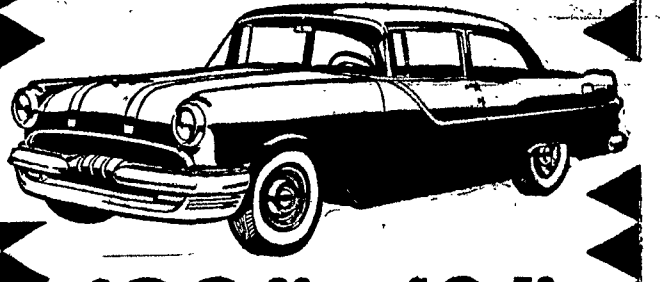
