Jose Echaniz To Speak At College Lecture Series

Lambda Chi Rho's third speaker, noted pianist Jose Echaniz, will be heard on Sunday, May 7 at 3:15 p.m. in the auditorium of St. John Fisher College. Echaniz, a member of the Major Piano Faculty of the Eastman School of Music, will discuss "Making Sense With Music."

A native of Cuba and one-time soloist with the Havana Symphony, Echaniz made his Town Hall debut at the age of 14 and thereafter studied music intensively at the University of Havana before coming to Rochester.

The well known concert pianist has given recitals in more than 200 American cities as well as in Europe and South America. In addition, he was conductor of the Grand Rapids Symphony for five years, and has served with various orchestras including the Chicago, Cincinnati, Minneapolis, Philadelphia and Rochester Symphonies.

His talk will consist mainly of a discussion of musical form and will be accompanied by a demonstration on the piano. All students of St. John Fisher College, Nazareth College and St. Mary School of Nursing are invited.

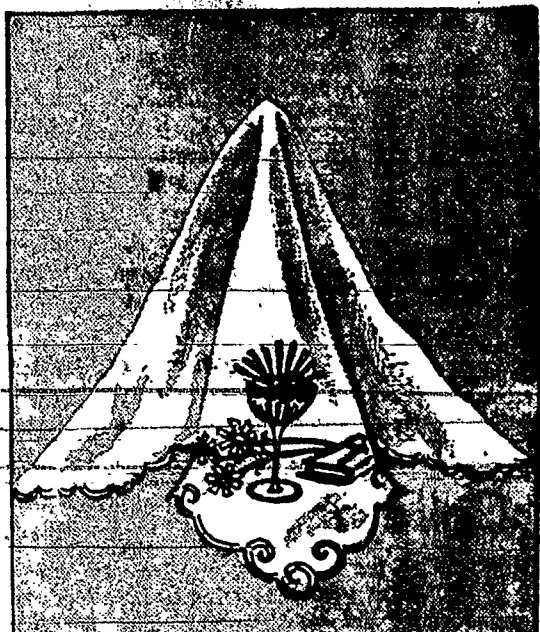

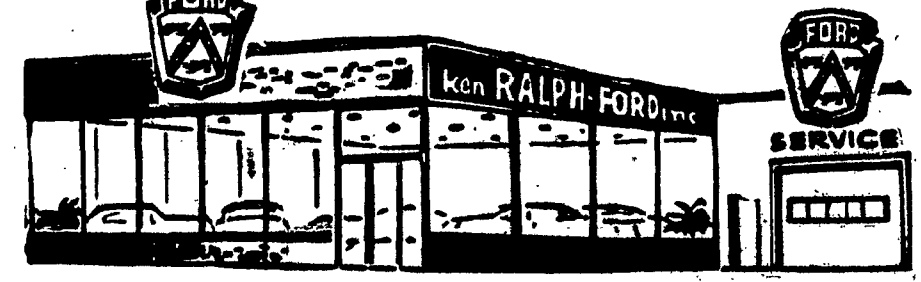
