Annual Retreat Set For High School Boys

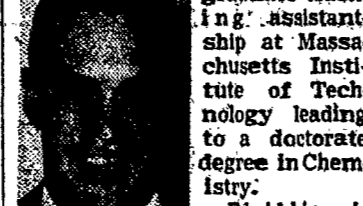
