Nazareth College Graduation Speakers, Candidates For Degrees Announced

The Honorable John F. Brogan, member of the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York, will deliver the Nazareth College commencement address, Wednesday, June 1 at 4 p.m. Sister Rose Angela Dean, announced today.

Speaker at the Baccalaureate Mass on Sunday, May 29 at 10 a.m. will be the Rev. Joseph L. Hogan, S.T.D., principal of DeSales High School, Geneva. His Excellency, Bishop James E. Kearney will be celebrant of the Mass. Students will sing music at the Mass composed by Flor Peeters in honor of St. Joseph.

Officers of the Mass are: Archbishop, Very Rev. Msgr. John F. Maney, S.T.D., Chancellor; Deacons of Honor to the Bishop, Rev. William J. Naughton and Rev. Edward J. Lintz, Ph.D.; Deacon of the Mass, Rev. William H. Shannon, Ph.D.; Subdeacon, Rev. Charles V. Boyle, Ph.D.; Subdeacon on Crossbearer, Rev. J. A. Russell Pendergast, C.S.B., M.A.; Master of Ceremonies, Rev. John L. Coonan, Pontifical Server, students from St. Andrew's Seminary.

Senior Week at the college will begin Saturday, May 28, with a Day of Recollection for seniors. Conferences will be given by Rev. Dr. Edward J. Lintz.

DR. BROGAN, a prominent New York lawyer, was associated with "New York County" Surrogate's Court and since 1923 has been a member of the firm of Mudge, Stern, Baldwin and Todd of Wall St.

He is also a member of the De La Salle Institute College, and New York University Law School. Dr. Brogan also holds honorary degrees from Manhattan College, St. John's University and Fordham University.

Brogan is a member of the New York County Lawyers' Association, American Bar Association, the New York State Bar Association, the Society of Medical Jurisprudence, the Association of the Bar of the City of New York, the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Lawyers Guild, the American Irish Historical Society, and the United States Catholic-Historical Society.

DR. HOGAN, baccalaureate speaker, was ordained in Rochester in June 1942 and received his M.A. from Canisius College in 1949, following which he studied in Rome at the Angelicum, Dominican College, where he was awarded his Doctorate in Sacred Theology in June 1951. From 1951 to 1953 he was Professor of Sacred Theology at St. Andrew's Seminary and at Saint John Fisher College. In September 1953 he was appointed principal of DeSales High School, Geneva.

Honorary Degrees Listed At Niagara

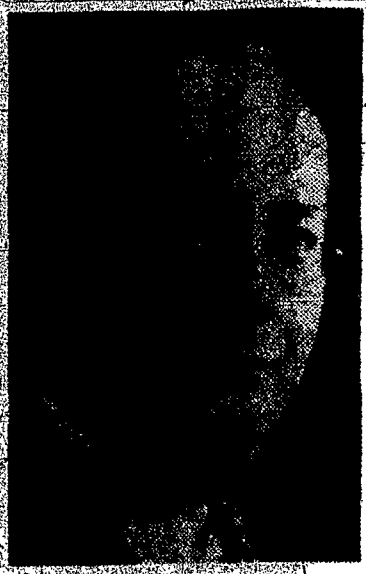
