Bishop Byrne's Life Published

A biography of Bishop Patrick J. Byrne, Maryknoll missionary and first Apostolic Delegate to Korea, who died in a "booby" trap of the allies in Aomori, has been published. The book was brought out by the P. J. Murphy and Sons firm in New York according to NCWC News Service.

Bishop Byrne spent much of his life in the Maryknoll missions in Korea and Japan. He died as a result of communist mistreatment in Korea on Nov. 25, 1950, shortly after the Korean conflict began.

During World War II, he was interned in Japan, and in post-war periods he was one of the most respected American figures in Japan. He visited Rochester and Auburn down through the years.
