Missionary Sister Enroute From Philippines To Africa

A native of Rochester, Sister Pierre Bisquette of the Holy Ghost, has returned motherhouse in Techny, Ill., of 1954 and again during the school year of 1954-55. Lay catechists are essential to help preserve and restore the Faith in the Philippines because of the lack of priests and religious. Recently the Rochester nun was appointed to the congregation's African mission in the Gold Coast, where she will teach in the secondary school, a teacher-training institution. There she expects to find a new type of work under an entirely different system of education—the English. Sister expects to leave the States in the fall.

BESIDES HER regular teaching, Sister Pierre has supervised groups of students who went out twice a week for catechetical work in the public schools. During the past year the group consisted of 48 catechists teaching in the morning session of Balagtas Elementary School after the regular class hours.

Since the archdiocese of Manila has organized a Catechetical Institute for the training of catechists, Sister also gave a course in dogma to a class of men and boys during the summer vacation.

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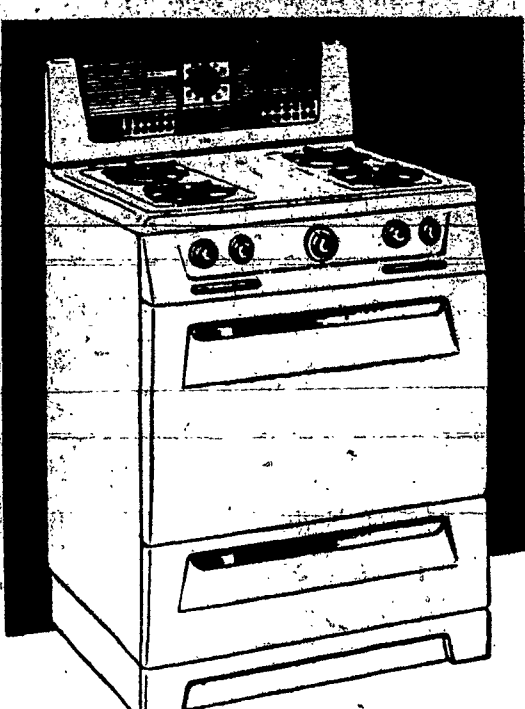
