THE flight into Egypt is not something that happened; it is something that is happening. Substitute the word Southern Vietnam for Egypt, Ho-Chi-Minh for Herod, the Communists for the soldiers, the hammer and sickle for the sword. As Mary gathered up her child to flee from the wrath of a king who was afraid of losing his throne, crown to One Who brought a golden one, so the Mothers of Viet-Nam have gathered up their children—some unborn—and fled the Communist fury of Northern Viet-Nam. In the twenty-two refugee camps of Southern Viet-Nam, 4,779 children were born in eight months. The mortality rate was high, because of the long marches from Communist territory, and because of the torrid heat of the tents in which families were obliged to live after the flight.

Christ lives in the afflicted, whether the afflicted know it or not; Christ lives in the consoler only when the consoler acts in the name of Christ. Whether the Christ Who suffers in these 600,000 refugees will have a Christ consoler, depends on you who read this column.

If you had fled to Mexico because of persecutions here, and if Viet-Nam had an average income of \$1,750 a year, would you not expect that "charity" would not be so much to be consorted, as to be consorted. Put in your pocket or purse a little crucifix, and you will discover that the magic will turn your money into sacrifice. It is not so much ours to receive as to give. Send your sacrifice to us, that we may send it to the Holy Father for the poor of the world.

### Fr. Courneen Assigned To Missions Of Bolivia

Maryknoll — Assigned to the missions of Bolivia, the Rev. James P. Courneen of Rochester, will take part in Maryknoll's 38th annual Departure Ceremony on Sunday, June 12 at 3:30 p.m. here. Bishop George J. Rehring of Toledo will give the principal address.

Father Courneen is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank D. Courneen, of 54 Rugby Ave., Rochester. He graduated from Fordham University before entering Maryknoll in 1940.

Since his ordination to the priesthood in 1945 he has represented Maryknoll in the Houston, Texas area. He is well known in Houston and New York City having spent considerable time in both places.

MARYKNOLLES in Bolivia are stationed in the high cold of the Andes, and in the jungle heat of the headwaters of the Amazon River. The Pando Vicariate, a jungle area of the northeast, covering some 40,000 square miles and 50,000 people, was assigned to Maryknoll in 1942. The average annual income of families in this area is only \$50. Maryknollers have started economic and social projects in this area to help raise the standard of living.

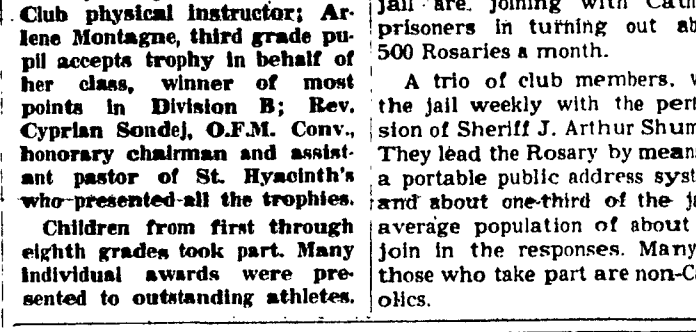

Those participating in the ceremony will renew their Oath of Fidelity, by which each promises to consecrate his whole life to the work of the missions committed to the society. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will conclude the ceremony.

Members of this year's departure group have been assigned to the missions of Africa, Japan, Korea, Formosa, the Philippines, Middle America, Bolivia, Peru, Chile and the Hawaiian Islands.
