

Catholic Hospitals Patron Saints Listed in Book

St. Louis—(NC)—“Patron Saints of the Catholic Hospitals”, a 31-page book on the lives of the patron saints of the various professions within the hospital field, has been published by the Catholic Hospital Association of the United States and Canada, as a special project of its 40th anniversary.

THE BOOK was compiled by M. R. Kneiff, executive secretary to the CHA, with the assistance of representatives of the professions. Listed first among the patron

saints are Saint Francis of Assisi, the Ideal of Charity to God's Sick; and Saint Vincent de Paul, the Patron of Charitable Societies.

Two saints declared by Pope Leo XIII in 1886 as patrons of Catholic Hospitals and the Sick, and of Religious and Lay Nurses of both Sexes, are Saint John of God and Saint Camillus de Lellis.

THE OTHERS are Saint Luke, the Physician, patron of Catholic physicians; Saint Apollonia, patron of dentists; Saint Basil the Great, and Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, patrons of hospital administrators; Saint Joseph, Foster Father of Christ, patron of procurators and business office workers; Saint Paul, the Apostle, patron of public relations.

Also Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, Saint Veronika, and Saint Catherine of Siena, patrons of nursing and nursing service; Saints Cosmas and Damian, patron saints of pharmacy and medicine; Saint Gemma Galgani, patron of hospital pharmacists; Saint Martha, patron of dietitians and dietary services.

SAINT ALBERT the Great, patron of medical technologists; Saint Januarius, patron of blood banking services; Saint Michael the Archangel, patron of radiologic services; Saint Peter, the Apostle, and Saint Raymond of Pennafort, patrons of medical librarians; Saint Rene Goupill, patron of anesthetists; and Saint John Francis Regis, patron of medical social workers.

Listed along with the brief sketch of the lives of the particular saints are the feast days and the special prayer.

Jesuit Educator Urges Aid To Medical Schools

Washington—(NC)—Governor Raymond S. Hanson and his cabinet are urged to support a bill for the construction of a new medical school at Loyola University, Chicago. Testifying before a Senate subcommittee, Father Hussey said the proposed Senate bill for construction and research grants to medical schools will "make possible the perpetuation of American medical education in the traditions of both public and private education."

He said that passage of the bill, S. 1233, would mean, in Loyola's case, the difference between a "modern" medical school in the near future and

many years of "strenuous struggle to secure sufficient funds for our new school, thereby postponing our part in the solution of the national health problem."

The Jesuit president also pointed out that the matching gift feature of the bill has good psychological effects on donors. He said it gives them a feeling that they are "putting their shoulders to a wheel which is already going" and that their taxes are being spent on projects in which they have "faith, interest, and concern."

Castillejos, Philippines—(NC)—President Ramon Magsaysay of the Philippines and his family recently visited their hometown parish and made the visit a happy occasion for the pastor, Father Edward O'Connor, a Columbian missionary.

'Miracle Girl' Patsi Li Graduates From High School

Williamsburg, Va.—(NC)—Worlds apart are the sweltering World War II battleground that was Guadalcanal in the South Pacific and the peace and tranquility of Walsingham Academy here in picturesque Colonial Williamsburg. They are the two worlds Patsi Li, now 19, has known. She's ready to enter a third world.

PATSI LI gained worldwide fame as "The Miracle Girl of World War II."

She was one in a class of 19 who were graduated from the academy high school here conducted by the Sisters of Mercy. A convert to Catholicism, Patsi LI now more formally Patricia Marie LI, took down top prizes for Religion, and also won a scholarship to Gwynedd-Mercy Junior College on the outskirts of Philadelphia. She plans a career in nursing.

Persons who were responsible for taking her out of the horrors of her first world and introducing her to a kinder second world were the hand to see Auxiliary Bishop Joseph H. Hodges of Richmond award her a diploma. One of these was Father-Frederic E. Giering, C.M., hero chaplain of Guadalcanal and now director of Vincentian Missions in Philadelphia.

PATSI, WITH her mother and younger sister, Lottie, in February, 1942, boarded a ship for Shanghai to escape the advancing Japanese. The ship was sunk by Japanese bombers. Patsi's sister was lost and the last Mrs. Li saw of Patsi, she was floating away to sea on a piece of wreckage.

Eight months later, on Guadalcanal a group of Christian natives carried a "miracled" Chinese girl into the lines of the Marines, battling against odds to hold the island. They delivered the girl to Father Gehring, chaplain of the Marines.

Navy doctors nursed the girl back to health.

At the request of Marines, who had adopted the four-year-old.
