

# Catholic Colleges Get Federal Science Grants

Washington (AP)—Awards of federal grants in scientific research to several Roman Catholic colleges and universities were announced here by the National Science Foundation.

Among 287 grants made from funds appropriated by Congress to encourage research in basic science was a \$15,000 award to St. Mary's College, Winona, Minn., to assist the college with the 30-day Great Lakes Biology Conference to be held on its campus under sponsorship of the National Association of Biology Teachers.

## OTHER GRANTS Included

\$10,500 to Duquesne University, Pittsburgh, Pa., for chemical research into naphthalene, and \$4,400 to Quincy College, Quincy, Ill., to finance a biological research investigation of "bottom fauna" in the Mississippi River. An award was made to Dr. Keith J. Laifler of Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C., to enable him to attend the international meeting of the Faraday Society of Microwave Spectrometry at Cambridge, England.

Dr. Ernest J. Eilat of Notre Dame University received a grant to finance his trip as an American delegate to the 14th International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry at Zurich, Switzerland, and Dr. J. L. Magee of Notre Dame to attend a symposium on radiation liquids at Paris, France.

# Modified Athletic Programs Set By Six Catholic Colleges

Brooklyn (AP)—Six Catholic colleges interested in a moderate approach to athletics have banded together to form the Middle Eastern College Athletic Association.

In making the announcement of their action, the directors of athletics at the schools said they did not want "to fall victim to the growing overemphasis on athletics."

THE MEMBERS of the new association are: Iona College (Irish Christian Brothers), New Rochelle, N.Y.; LeMoynes College (Jesuits), Syracuse, N.Y.; St. Bonaventure University (Franciscan Fathers), Olean, N.Y.; St. Francis College (Franciscan Brothers), Brooklyn, N.Y.; St. Peter's College (Jesuits), Jersey City, N.J.; and Siena College (Franciscan Fathers), Albany, N.Y.

The athletic directors' statement stressed that the move "in no way indicates a de-emphasis on athletics, but rather is intended to avoid the pitfalls of overemphasis; it does not represent a change in athletic policy at any of the member institutions."

None of the colleges currently sponsors a football team, but at each basketball is considered the major sport. Iona, St. Francis, Siena and St. Bonaventure have frequently played at Madison Square Garden and from all indications will continue to do so.

FIRST ASSOCIATION-sponsored competition is tentatively scheduled for the fall; a golf tournament at Siena, a cross country meet at LeMoynes and a tennis tourney at Iona.

In basketball, a league will be conducted with each team meeting each other team once, for a total of five league games. The schedule will not interfere with traditional rivalries because most of the schools have been playing each other for years.

The Middle Eastern Association will sponsor competition in other sports, with baseball, track, bowling, marksmanship, and swimming already on the agenda for the annual meeting, to be held in New York City every December.
