Chicago — (NC) — The age of Romanticism — when society wanted its ladies to be gentle - was extolled by His Eminence Samuel Cardinal Stritch in one of his two commencement addresses to graduates of women's col-

Peron Ousts Pretates From Posts, Terrorism Hits Church In Argentina

Buenos Aires — (RNS) — Auxiliary Bishop Manuel Tato, Vicar General of the Buenos Aires Archdiocese, and Msgr. Ramon Novoa, Canon of the Metropolitan Chapter, have been expelled from the country following their arrests.

The arrests and expulsions came on the heels of a government decree dismissing the two prelates from their official positions. The decree charged them with defying civil authorities and provoking riots which broke out after the observance of Corpus Christi Day on June 11.

The two churchmen were deported aboard a passenger plane of the government-owned airlines.

A report from Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, said they had arrived there and had told newsmen, "We were expelled to
