Bishop Kearney To Dedicate Church, Rectory Of St. Vincent's, Corning

Corning — The new \$385,000 St. Vincent de Paul church and rectory will be blessed by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, during the regular 11 a.m. Mass Sunday (June 28), according to plans announced this week.

Bishop Kearney, in addition to blessing the church, will be celebrant for Mass and will preach the special sermon. Some 50 priests of the Rochester diocese will be on hand for the blessing service, and several will participate in the Mass. Host pastor for the Mass will be the Rev. Joseph V. Guilfoil, who came to the parish June 4, 1940. During the past several years, Father Guilfoil, has directed fund raising projects to carry out the big building program to care for the rapidly expanding church and parochial school needs for Northside Catholics.

The new Lenox hand-trimmed stone church, built during the past year on a large plot of church-owned property at Elliott St. and Dodge Ave., will be used for the first time at all Masses Sunday morning: 6, 7, 8, 9:15 and 11 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. All future Masses will also be said in the new church.

Architects for the new church were Joseph P. Flynn and Herbert E. Bohack of Rochester, and contracting firm was Smith, Langhans and McLaughlin, Corning.

Following the 11 a.m. Mass, Bishop Kearney, the some 50 visiting priests and nuns of the

parish will attend a breakfast in the church basement.

The appeals of Bishop Kearney and Father Guilfoil were answered, with about \$214,000 pledged, of which about \$100,000 has already been collected. The blessing of the new church Sunday morning is making the dream of Father Guilfoil come true.

The main entrance of the new church will be on Elliott St. and the church, measuring about 145 by 50 feet, borders on Dodge Ave. The \$385,000 total cost of the building project covers architect fees, furnishings,
