Fort Myer, Va. (NC) — The Four Chaplains Award for 1955 was presented here to Army Chaplain (1st Lt.) Cormac A. Walsh of Boston, Mass., by Gen. Matthew B. Ridgeway, Army Chief of Staff.

Father Walsh, who was chosen for the 1955 award by the Chaplains Branch of the Army, served with the 180th Infantry Regiment, 45th Division, from August, 1952, to September, 1953, in Korea. He was ordained in 1948 as a Franciscan priest and joined the Army as a reserve officer in March, 1953.
