Monroe Falls.—Sixth annual conference on Christian Unity for the Friars of the Atonement was held at St. John Atonement Seminary, Montour Falls. Priest delegates came to the meeting from Providence, R. I., Washington, D.C., Saranac Lake, N. Y., and Grayson, Garrison, N. Y. Fr. Rev. Magr. Joseph C.
