# 'Moscow Chaplain' **Denies** 'Churches Open In Russia

He Was There 2 Years

Father Bissonnette served for two years as Catholic chapiain to the foreign colony in Moscow until his sudden expulsion. by the Kremlin earlier this year. During his stay in Russia he traveled over large areas of the Soviet Union.

The statement of a U.S. Baptist clergyman that there are 1,500 Catholic churches open for worship in Soviet Russia is utterly unrealistic.

The assertion was made, according to widely circulated newspaper reports, by Dr. Theodore Adams of Richmond, Va., president of the Baptist World Alliance, after completing a two-weeks visit to the Soviet Union, interim

The figures cited by Dr. Adams are those repeatedly given to foreigners by Intourist, the Soviet tourist agency. The Intourist people have a stock answer ready for all questions. However, the answers do not necessarily bear any elation to reality.

Outside of the Baltic states, taken over by the Soviets during World War II, I know of only four Catholic churches in the Soviet Union open for worship and served by a pricat. They are the Church of St. Louis of France in Moscow, served by Father Joseph Butor. ovich Adamovich, and churches, In Leningrad, Kishinev (the espital of Moldavia) and Thilisi (Georgia).

The prelate is the exiled Bishop of Yuanling, Hunan Province, China. A veteran missionary in that country, he was arrested by the Chinese Communists on. Christmas Day, 1950, and imprisoned for 22 months before being expelled from the country.

BISHOP O'GARA spoke at a Communion breakfast during the 20th annual convention of the Catholic War Veterans of the United States.

"Today we stand at the cross "It may take five years," the roads." Bishop O'Gara declared. "Our faith is challenged: our country is on the defensive, not to say on the run.

The prelate said he was amazed and shocked" at the pre vailing sentiment in this country "that it cannot happen here." "It is my humble opinion that it can happen here," he said. Terming the U.S. recognition of the Soviet Union in 1933 a "tragic blunder," Bishop O'Gara declared that, instead of promised prosperity and gold, it had "brought upon us a flood of spies, saboteurs and fellowtravellers, each a carrier of vicious, deadly Communist propaganda.
