## Red War Crimes Against Americans Stirs Probe Demand

Washington — (NC) — A strong sentiment is building up for an international investigation of war crimes committed by communists against American prisoners in Korea, both during the fighting and after the armistice.

The interest is not centered here alone, but is manifested throughout the country. Veterans organizations in various sections are taking an interest in the matter.

A CONGRESSMAN, Representative Thomas J. Dodd of Connecticut, suggests the same action in a letter to Secretary of State Dulles, but he would not confine the investigation to the possibility of UN action alone. He says it could be carried out by that body, or by "a specially constituted international tribunal or commission." He says the U.S. could submit "numerous documented instances of atrocities and torture."

Interest in this proposal is heightened by the fact that this Government only in recent days made public a new code of conduct for U.S. servicemen in time of war.

"Surely, it is not too much to ask," Representative Dodd said to Secretary Dulles, "that, as we require our own soldiers and sailors and marines to carry the full responsibility of patriotic conduct even under the most difficult of circumstances, we demonstrate to them that those who subject our citizens to unspeakable brutalities and tortures will not escape condemnation and punishment."

IT IS NOTED here, too, that, within a matter of days, American Air Force personnel who have been released from illegal confinement have told the American public of the horrors of a life in a prison camp under Chinese communists.

In calling for this action on the part of our Government, the prime mover in this campaign asserts that U.S. prisoners of war taken in Korea were denied proper medical attention, subjected to over-exercising, starved, tortured physically and mentally, and murdered under atrocious circumstances, and that many in railway uniforms were seized and held as spies, a most serious violation of the rules of warfare. In addition, prisoners have been illegally detained after the cessation of hostilities.

Representative Dodd told the State Department that action by this Government resulting in an international investigation would bring to bear upon the communists the "tremendous power

and strength of public condemnation"; would inform and educate millions of people in the world who are still in a position to make a choice between communism and freedom, and would demonstrate in an unmistakable manner that the U.S. and its free-world associates "will not ignore or let pass unnoticed a planned course of barbarian and inhuman conduct."

Congressman Dodd was Chief Trial Counsel for the U.S. at the international trial of Nazi leaders in Nuremberg, Germany, in 1945 and 1946.

**Africans Pressed At Mariannhill**  
Mariannhill, Natal — (NC) — For the first time since the foundation of the great monastery at Mariannhill in 1882, three South African-born Brothers have been pressed there. They are Brothers Benedict Estrom, Bernard Cottier and Francis Croucher.

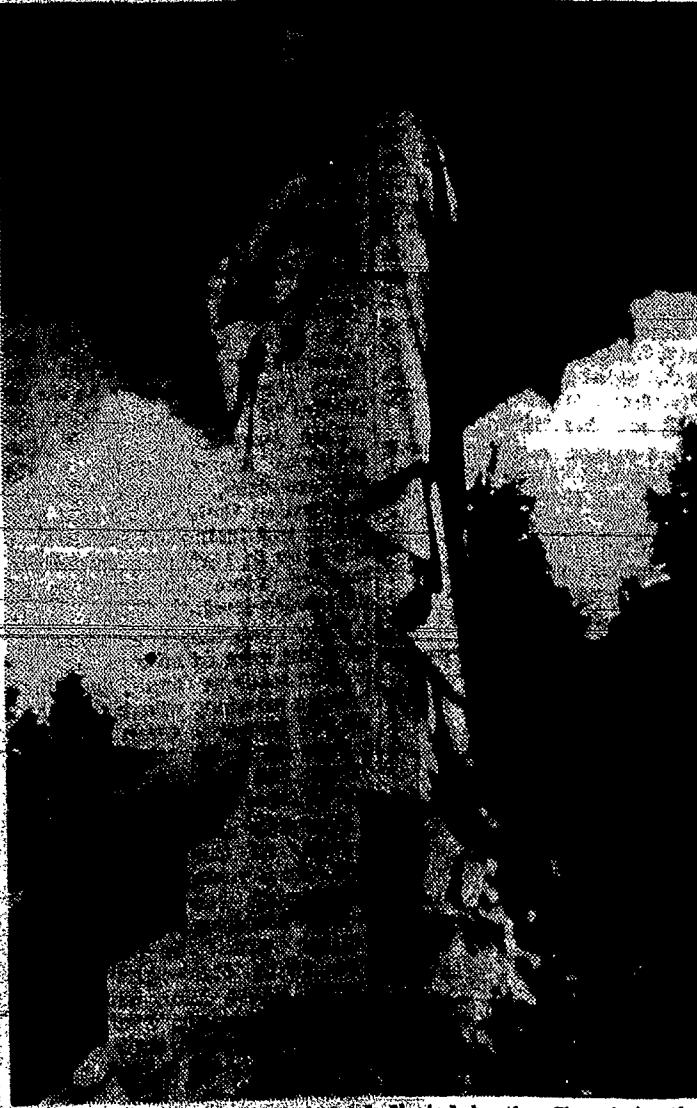
Mariannhill monastery was founded by Trappist monks, but the difficulty of reconciling the strict monastic observance with missionary activity among the Zulus led St. Pius X to separate them from the Cistercian Order and found a new one — the Congregation of Missionaries of Mariannhill.

Today, the order has missions, schools and monasteries not only in South Africa, but in Europe, Canada and the United States. In 1923 the Diocese of Mariannhill had 135,300 Catholics — nearly all Zulus. In the following year the diocese was split in two, the new one being Umzimkulu, which is now headed by the first Zulu Bishop, Bishop Bonaventura Dlamini.

**New Peron War On Church Foes**  
Rio de Janeiro — (NC) — A renewed campaign of persecution against the Church in Argentina by the Peron regime has been predicted here by His Eminence Jaime Cardinal de Barros Cárdenas, Archbishop of Rio de Janeiro.

The prediction was made by the Cardinal in a radio address, in which he asked Brazilian Catholics to "pray fervently for the Argentine people."

Patricia Ann Lesser, U. S. Golf Association champion, was feted with a police escort through Seattle's downtown "Welcome Lane" and a public reception held on the Seattle campus with hundreds of civic, educational and professional dignitaries plus a host of friends congratulating her.

Pat administered a crushing 7 and 6 defeat to Jane Ann Nelson of Indianapolis to win the 56th national title in a 36 hole final at Charlotte, N. C.

IT WAS a grand slam year for Miss Lesser, a 22-year-old senior at Seattle University and a product of Catholic schools all the way. She had won the 55th running of the Women's Western Amateur in Chicago July 30. Earlier she took the Helax Les

Doherty Cup and the South Atlantic Amateur titles in Florida. Daughter of Col. and Mrs. Louis L. Lesser of Assumption Parish here, she is majoring in sociology at Seattle U., conducted by the Jesuit Fathers. She played as "sixth man" on the SU varsity for three straight years.

## Scorn 'Wolf Whistlers,' Teen-Age Girls Advised

Chicago — (NC) — The 30 world of paganism is ensnaring too many young Catholics, Father William D. Ryan, S.J. of California told 2,400 teenagers gathered here for a Summer School of Catholic Action. He defined the three "d's" as "dolls, dollars, and desperation."

Doll psychology is a child of the new "Monroe Doctrine," the priest said. He added: "The fact that you girls don't feel anything when you get a wolf doll mentality has affected you. A wolf whistle should make you feel clumsy and unclean."

He advised girls to "turn around and quench the fellow in the eye" to let men know they do not approve of the whistle.

It is a disappointment, Father Ryan said, when girl parishioners ask if they may enter beauty contests. "The answer is always of course not."

The dollar complex also is demoralizing youth, Father Ryan said. He declared: "Nothing is good unless it's big, fast, flashy, speedy and 'the most.' The most what? You have a complex about the VIP, the very important person. You want to be a big-time operator, a wheel."

FATHER RYAN told the teenagers to stop surrendering to modern pagan values. Pointing to the warring, stultified, just-infantile and other crimes of ancient Rome, he said: "Christ lived out on the fringe
