SVD Missionaries Total 10,000 On 80th Birthday

Conesus, N. Y. — Divine Word Missionaries, one of the youngest and fastest growing missionary orders in the Catholic Church, was celebrating its 80th anniversary, according to the Very Rev. Casimir Murawski, S.V.D., superior of the Divine Word seminary here.

The order also has 25 parishes, 25 grammar schools, 10 high schools and one industrial school. Most of these are in the South.

For training their American personnel they have nine Divine Word seminaries in nine different states: Bay St. Louis, Miss.; Bordenovon, N. J.; Conesus, N. Y.; East Troy, Wis.; Epworth, Ia.; Girard, Pa.; Island Creek, Mass.; Marensico, Mich.; and Tenney, Ill.

A tenth seminary is to be opened next year at Ferrysburg, Ohio. They also have a house of studies in Washington, D. C.

Last year Divine Word Missionaries baptized 81,000 adults and children, treated 1,155,000 patients in their clinics and hospitals, and instructed 162,500 boys and girls in 1,880 mission schools ranging from kindergarten to university level.

They have also been entrusted with the care of an additional 34 million souls in China, their first foreign mission, where they had 25,000 converts when their 300 priests and 60 brothers were driven out of the country by the Chinese Communists.

Venerable Arnold Janssen, the founder of the order, died in 1903. As a young diocesan priest his interest was aroused in the foreign missions by a Jesuit publication which he distributed, "The Little Messenger of The Sacred Heart. Chairman, Hugh A. Doyle, Past State Deputy, of the Flood Relief Committee of New York State is arranging to forward additional shipments to Pennsylvania and Rhode Island K. of C. Relief Committees.

The State-wide meeting decided to expand the appeal because of the continued urgent need in the disaster areas, and a general appeal is now being directed to the public at large to aid the work of the Committee.

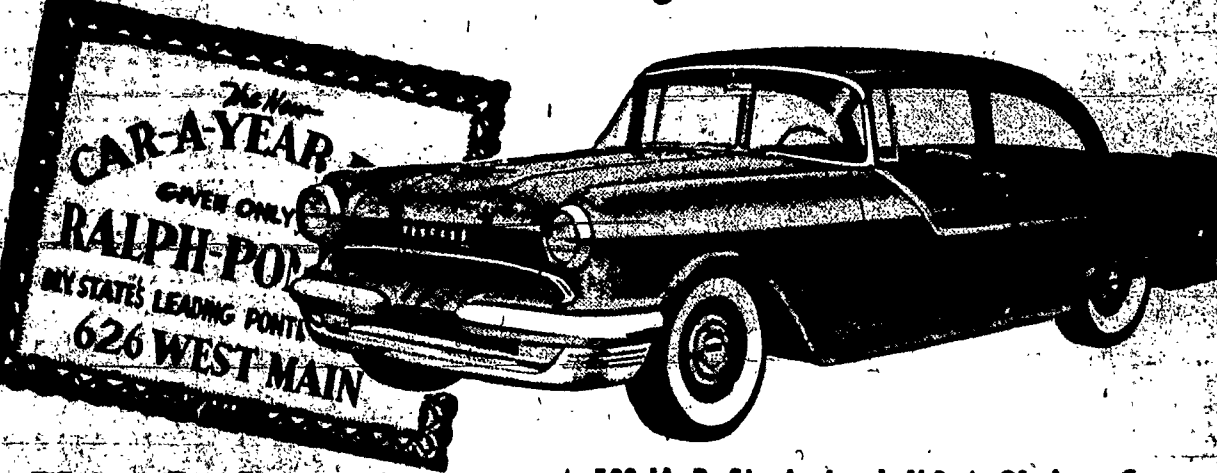

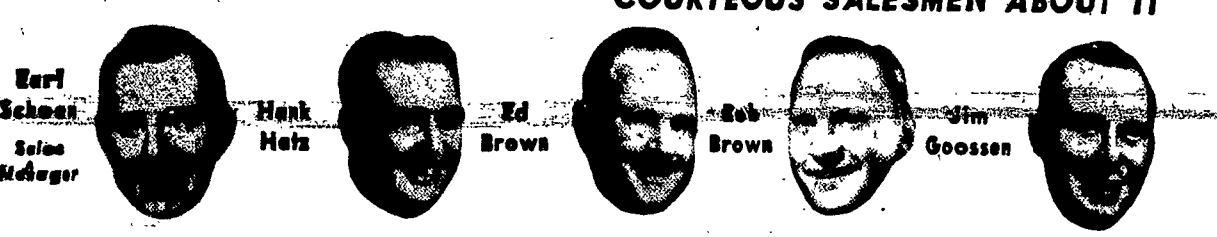
