The new St. Jerome School building in East Rochester was opened on Wednesday, Sept. 8 with 280 boys and girls in four grades. A grade will be added in the new school, each year, until there are eight according to the Rev. Roy B. Morphy.

Father Morphy and the Rev. Anthony F. Calimeri, assistant pastor were on hand to greet the pupils.

The new school is a one-story cement block structure faced with red Roman brick.

LOCATED ON property at West Avenue and South Garfield St., East Rochester, the new building is one story with provision for a second story. The entrance is of granite squares set back in a raised courtyard effect. The kindergarten has a separate entrance on West Filbert St.

The new school will comprise eight rooms besides the kindergarten, a principal's office, nurse's room, library room, lunch room—an Sisters' faculty room.

The rear wall of the Columbus Youth Center has been broken through and a stage constructed for both the school and the C.Y.A. programs. The main entrance is on South Garfield St.
