### Greece Central School Lists Adult Law Course

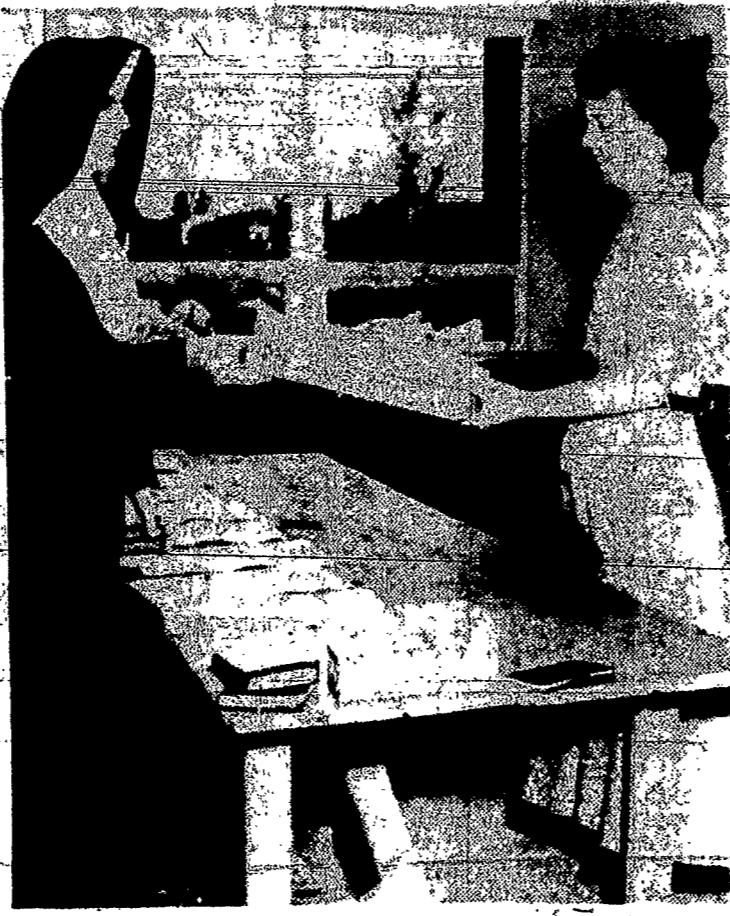
A course in "Law for the Layman" will be offered in the fall term of the adult education program of the Greece Central School District, at Britton Road School.

### 7 Rochesterians Begin Nursing Study In Elmira

Thirty-six young women including eleven Elmiraans and seven from Rochester will enter St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing, Sunday afternoon, September 11. The course comprises a three year period, the first six months designated as the pre-clinical period. During this time, principally devoted to theory, the students will have their courses in Religion, the basic sciences, and Nursing Arts.

Toward the latter part of this period, they will be assigned to the patient units for a limited time daily.

At the successful completion of the pre-clinical period, the students will receive their caps and be formally accepted into the school. The clinical period includes theory and practice in Medical and Surgical Nursing, operating room nursing, Obstetrical nursing, Nursing of Children, and Diet Laboratory experience at the Home School, and two affiliations, one in Tuberculosis Nursing and one in Psychiatric Nursing. The former affiliation will be at the Hermann M. Briggs Memorial Hospital, Ithaca, and the latter at Ulica State Hospital, Utica.

ON COMPLETION of the course, a Diploma will be awarded by St. Joseph's Hospital

School of Nursing, and the graduates will then be eligible to take the New York State examination, leading to licensure as a Registered Professional Nurse.

An orientation program has been planned for the new students during their first week at St. Joseph's. This will include introduction to classes, tours through the hospital and Nurses' Residence, and "Get-acquainted" parties given by their "Big Sisters" of the Junior class.
