Abbot's Sudden Death Overseas Shocks Diocese

(Continued from Page 1) Over 20 monks now live at the Abbey, working at dairy farming and wheat growing, and the baking of Monk's Bread, an important item in the community's self-supporting program.

Abbot McGinley, called for France last September, was Lina Liberte, in company with Abbot McGinley to attend the world meeting of his Order.

BEFORE RETURNING home, he had planned visiting the shrines of Lourdes and Fatima and having an audience with Pope Pius XII. He also intended inspecting several monasteries in Europe to get ideas for plans on a new abbey-building which he hoped to begin construction on within two years.

Abbot McGinley was a well known speaker in diocesan circles. His lecture last year in the Thomas More Lecture Series at the Rochester Chamber of Commerce was a popular highlight in the season's offerings.

DOM GERARD received the Minor and Major orders and was ordained to the priesthood on Dec. 21, 1935. He was made guest-master in 1940 and until 1943 served as retreatmaster of laymen and priest retreatants. During this period he was also the infirmarian of the Abbey.

Appointed master of lay brothers in 1946, Dom Gerard became master of choir novices in 1947, which office he held until he was made Prior of Gethsemani in November, 1949.

His appointment as superior of Our Lady of the Genesee campus on Aug. 22, 1949 and after two years of preparation, he left the Abbey of Gethsemani with his fellow pioneers on May 25, 1951 to make the first trappist foundation in New York State.

From the Sacred Heart Retreat House Aurisville, N. Y., where he is making his annual retreat, His Excellency Bishop Kearney sent this message to the Abbey at Plifard:

"We shall always be deeply indebted to this saintly gentleman who founded the first Cistercian monastery in New York State. The Abbot was deeply loved and esteemed by all of us and many of our gatherings were enriched spiritually by his inspired words. His community of all of us. We have all lost a very dear friend. God grant that we may all be as ready for judgment as we know he was."

Auxiliary Bishop Casey offered like sympathies to the Trappist community. The Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Rochester, who had been a close friend since their meeting ten years ago at Gethsemani Abbey, was deeply grieved by the abbot's death.

Our Lady of the Genesee Abbey is located a mile northwest of the hamlet of Plifard, 30 miles from Rochester on a 500-acre tract of land given to the Trappists by Porter R. Chandler, prominent New York lawyer.
