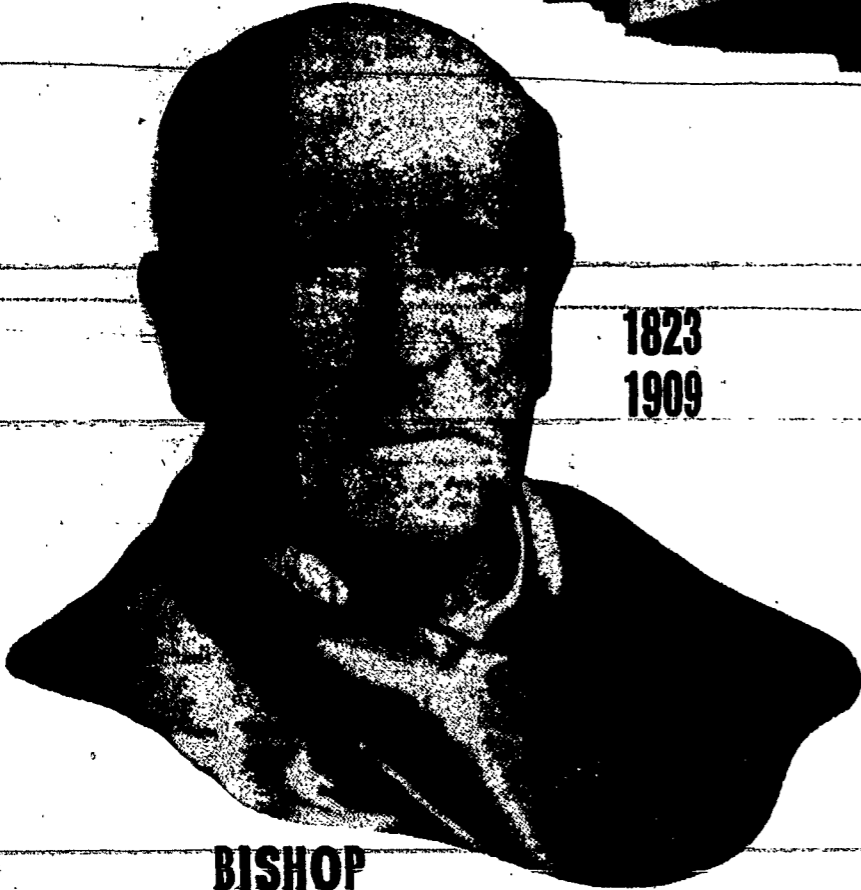
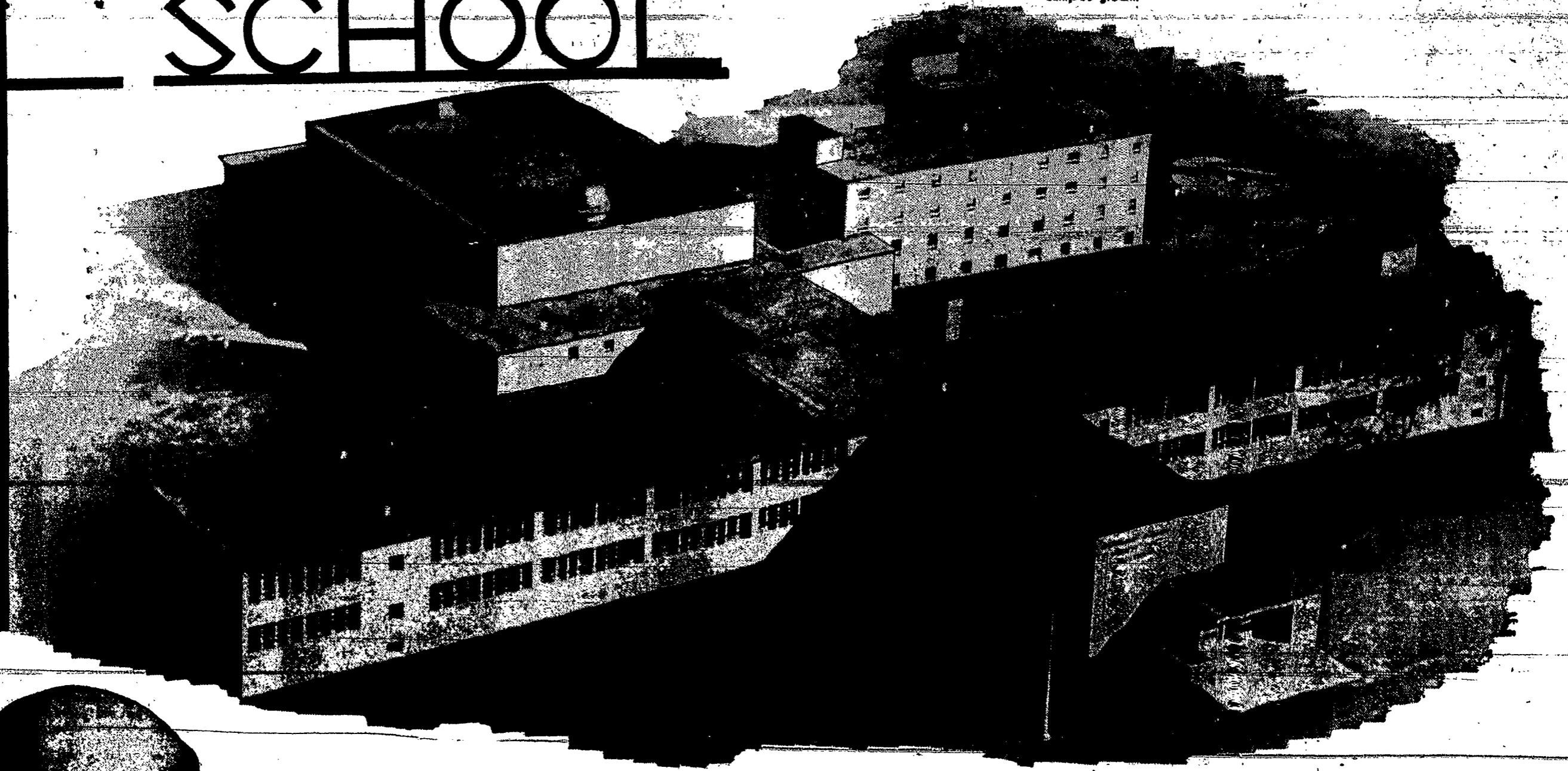


# MCQUAID JESUIT HIGH SCHOOL

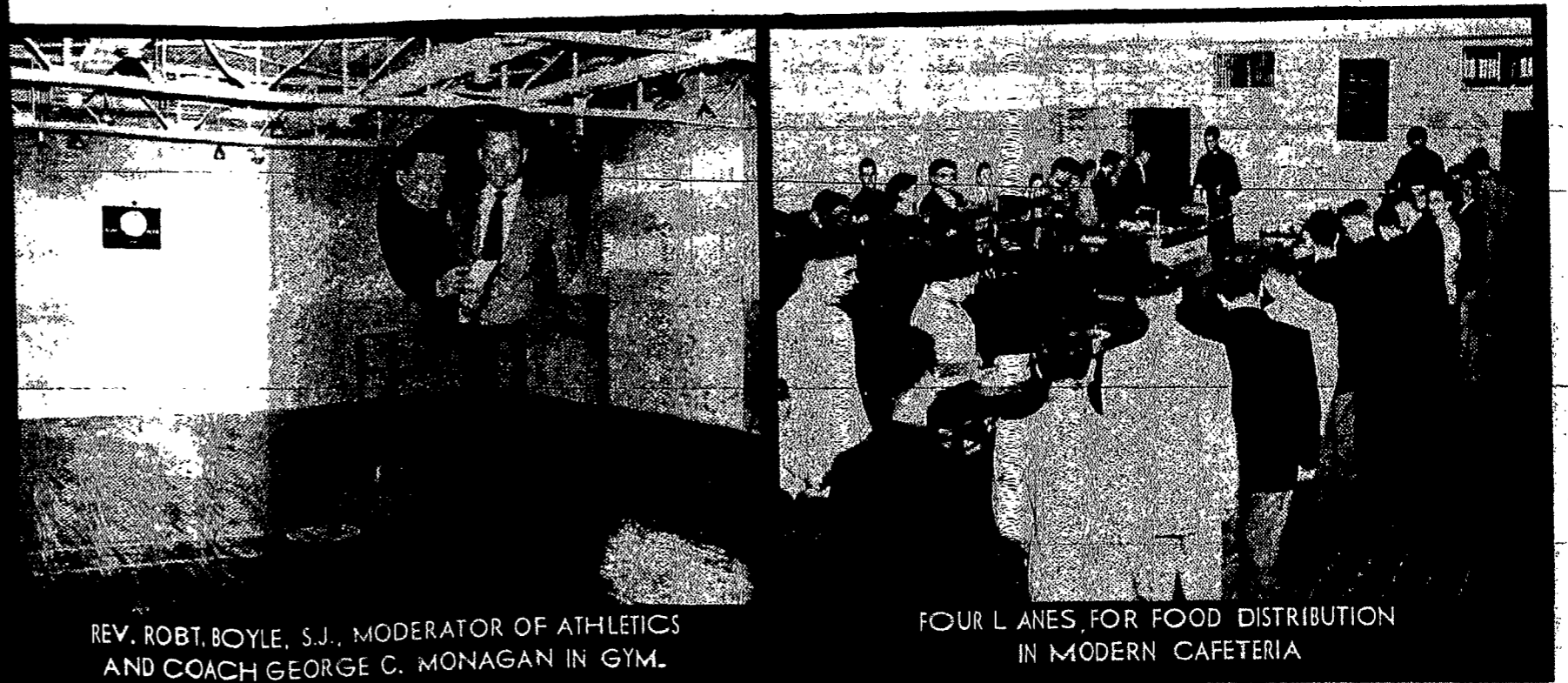
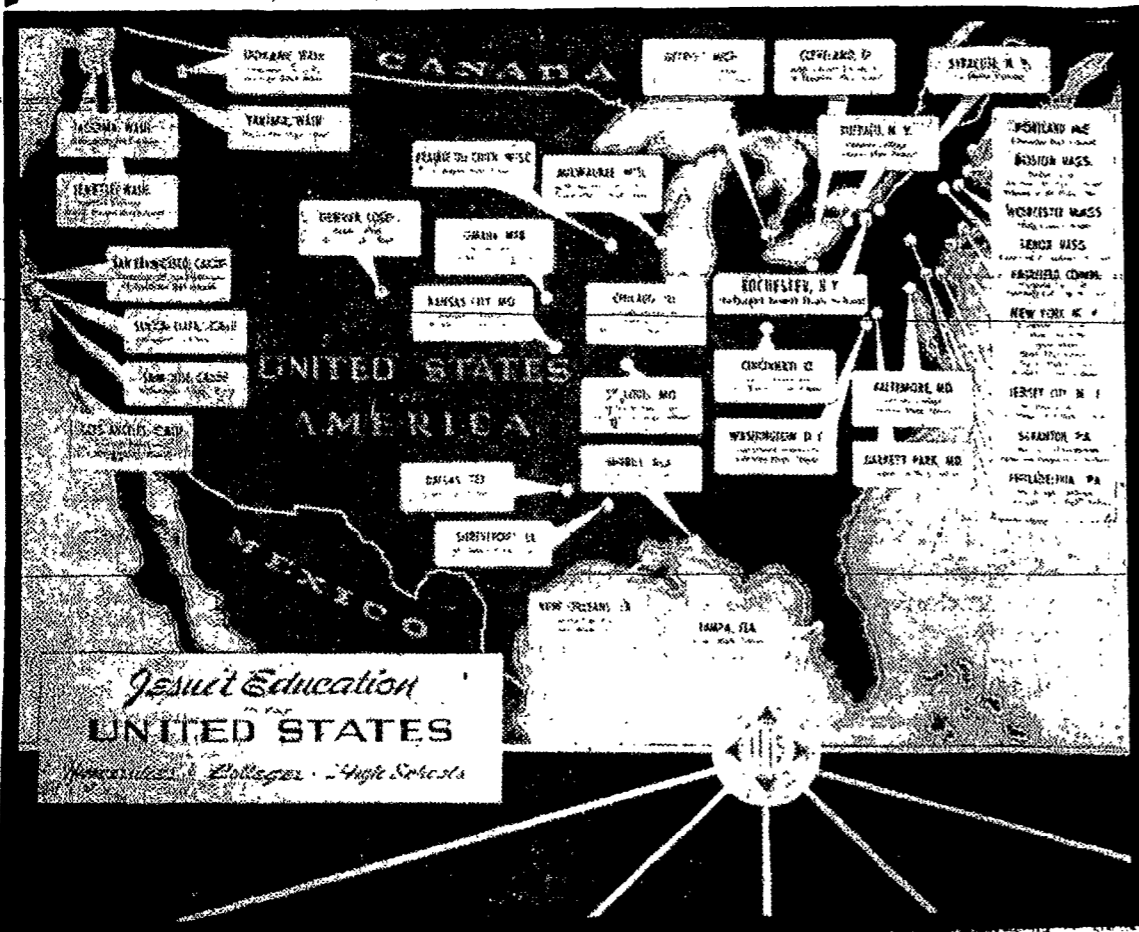

## JESUIT EDUCATION IN THE UNITED STATES

McQuaid Jesuit High School is the latest and forty-first, secondary school in the United States under the direction of the Society of Jesus. This new school is already part of an educational system which embraces hundreds of universities, colleges and high schools all over the world. Here in the United States the Jesuits conduct 29 colleges and universities for nearly 90,000 extern students, besides five colleges exclusively for the training of nearly 1,000 Jesuits. The 41 high schools in the United States have more than 25,000 boys enrolled at the present time. For 400 years thousands of high school boys have been successfully trained through the Jesuit system of education. The essentials of this system, as applied to high schools, consist of a traditional graduated program of courses in religion, languages, mathematics, the physical and social sciences, together with a mastery formula accomplished in large part by the application of the Jesuit prelection through the individual direction of each student by the class teacher.

This latest addition to the roster of Jesuit schools in the U.S. expects soon to have its alumni take their places with all the other loyal sons of Loyola in bringing greater glory to God in the service of mankind.
