Entertainment will be furnished by the Flower City Quartet. Chairman is Mrs. James N. Golden.

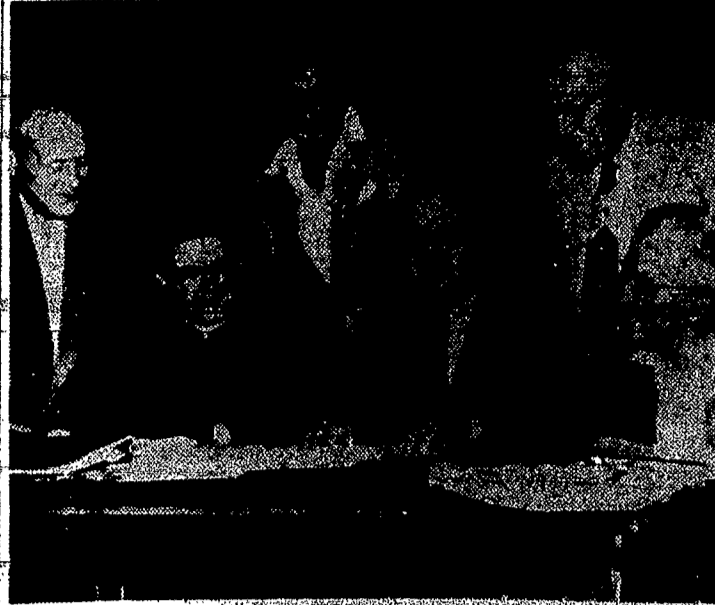
Sets Dessert Bridge
