**Carmel Quinn, Bennett Listed For Firemen's Show**

Two popular headliners will feature the annual stage show to be offered at the Eastman Theater Oct. 7-9 and 9 by the Rochester Firemen. 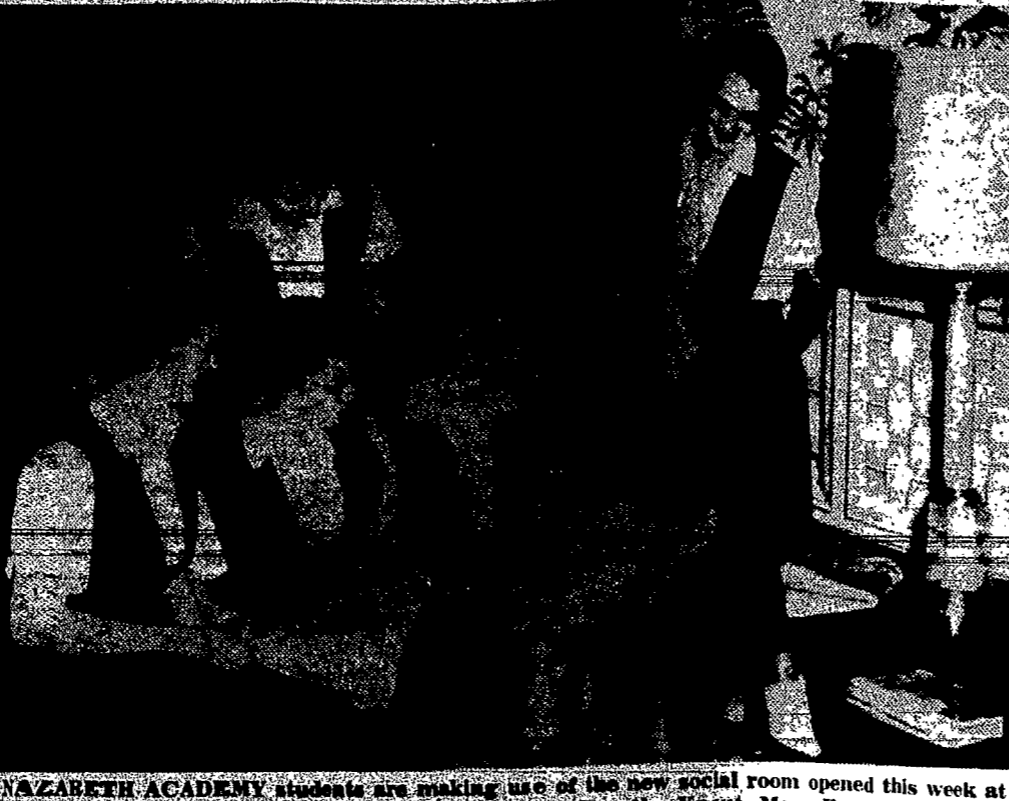
Second headliner will be Tony Bennett, the Columbia Records singing star who will be accompanied by Chuck Wayne on the guitar.

ALL THE PROCEEDS from the Firemen's Stage Show go to their death benefit fund, which requires about \$50,000 per year to maintain. Because of the hazardous nature of their job and comparatively modest compensation, firemen are seldom able to carry enough insurance to adequately protect their families and the death benefit fund provides \$3,000 for the family of each deceased fireman, a pocket money.

**Academy Opens Social Room, Expands Guidance**

The Guidance Department at Nazareth Academy has expanded its services this year to include the private interview for any student who desires it.

A modern, fully equipped office with an attractive waiting room has been opened on the second floor for the director of guidance. All students may avail themselves of the opportunity to discuss their problem with trained counselors during any period of the day, as well as before and after school.

ANOTHER FEATURE of the program is the furnishing of a social room to meet the increasing need for recreational facilities available to students who are not interested in gymnasium activities.

Fiber glass drapes cover the windows extending along the eastern side of the room. The western side has a mural of tropical design, carrying out a basic color scheme of coral, avocado green, and brown.

Functional furniture is of wood maple with brown and pumpkin plastic covering. Two Mahogany leather chairs, and two green antique pine wood lamps provide the lighting.

The chapel, too, has been remodelled to provide seating room for more students by the installation of pews, replacing the folding chairs of the original chapel. Paneling which is of quarter oak has been restored to its natural light finish. A new altar has been installed with complete new furnishings.

Stained glass windows with an original design have replaced the transparent window glass. Floor covering is of new vinyl tile.

**Nazareth Lecture Program Announced By College Dean**

Sister Rose Angela, Dean of Nazareth College, has announced the tentative schedule for the year's lecture program for students and their friends and families.

Beginning with the outdoor production of Elliott's *Marlowe* in the Cathedral by the Catholic Theatre group on last Wednesday evening, the program will include Canon Gabriel, head of Medieval Studies at Notre Dame University in Student Hour on Thursday afternoon, Oct. 27.

On the evening of Nov. 30 Roy Campbell, one of England's greatest living lyric poets, will speak on South Africa, where he grew up.

ANOTHER EVENING production by the Catholic Theatre group, Gian-Carlo Menotti's *The Saint of Brecker Street*, will be given Nov. 19 and 20.

Early in December, Dr. Richard Fettes, whose lectures last winter on the Scandinavian countries aroused so much enthusiasm, will come for a return engagement. This year he will talk about Israel, which he has just visited.

First lecturer in the new year will be Father Damasus Wizen of Mount Saviour in Elmira, who will speak on the evening of Jan. 4 on the liturgy of the church.
