New Parish of St. Pius X Receives Pope's Blessing

The Parish Building Fund Appeal of the new St. Pius X Church, Chili Ave., will be officially launched by His Excellency Bishop Kearney at a dinner in the Parish Hall at 6:30 p.m., Saturday, Oct. 22, the Rev. Donald J. Murphy, pastor announced today.
Parishioners of the newly established parish were heartened this week, by receipt of a cablegram from Vatican City, on Oct. 19.

The cablegram read: "The Holy Father, on the occasion of the founding of the new parish of St. Pius X cordially imparts to the pastor and to the faithful his paternal Apostolic Blessing." — Signed — Monsignor Dell'Acqua, Substitute Secretary of State.
A picture of St. Pius X which has a long history in the parish now appears in the church Sanctuary. Found in an attic covered with dirt and dust, the picture is a large colored print of St. Pius X showing him as he appeared when he first came to the Papal Throne in 1904.
The print shows him much younger than later pictures, and is especially interesting. Father

New St. Anthony Church Planned On Lorimer St.

Plans for a new St. Anthony Church building on Lorimer through to Montrose Street, four blocks north of the present church-school building at Lyell and Plymouth Avenues, were disclosed this week by the Rev. Michael J. Tydings, pastor.

Father Tydings explained that the proposed church building will be erected following construction of a new St. Anthony's School building, which is planned for occupancy next September. The school building will be erected just north of the proposed church site, opposite Jones Park, and will also contain an auditorium.
Parishioners are now organizing a church-school fund appeal campaign with a goal of \$150,000. General solicitation is scheduled Sunday, Oct. 30. Campaign workers will participate in a pep rally at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 27, in the present school hall.

HIS EXCELLENCY Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, will address the workers' kickoff dinner at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 29 in Lorenzo's Restaurant.
General chairman of the campaign committee is Frank Ridoto. Co-chairmen include Salvatore DeBlase, John P. DiCesare, John DiGaetano and Joseph Fico. Other committee chairmen are Peter DeLuca, special gifts; Michael Boverzi, survey; and Paschal Penna, friends of St. Anthony. Campaign division leaders are:

The proposed church building will be of contemporary architecture, Father Tydings said, and will feature a high bell tower at east corner. The front will be of cast stone and ledge rock to tie in with the proposed new parochial school. The church building will be of laminated frame, with wood-roof decking to show textured under-surface and to show off beams. The remainder of the deck will be of a slate roof of equal material. The narthex will be in flagstone.
The present marble altar will be placed in the new church, against a back wall of oak louvers or marble. Sloped skylights will "light" the sanctuary. The church will include a choir loft and a basement hall.
