

# Chattanooga Next For Aquinas Gridders

The hopes of Coach Frank (Hunk) Vadas and the Aquinas football team were brightened today when the information that this Sunday's opponent, Notre Dame High School of Chattanooga, is to be met in Memorial Stadium, have had a losing season so far this year.

The Chattanooga team like Aquinas lost its opening game only by a greater margin of 31-0. They went on to lose their next four games and then held their fifth opponent to a 0-0 deadlock.

This 0-0 stalemate cost the Tennesseans their star halfback Tommy Barr due to a broken leg. Coach Bill Hoter was quoted as saying "Our team is a really young one this year. We've lost all of our post graduates and now have a team consisting of all Freshmen and Sophomores with the exception of 3 Juniors and a couple of Seniors."

**False Faces of Senecas Shown In Marquette Booth**  
Authentic copies of false faces worn by the Seneca Indians in New York State are being shown at the Marquette League for Catholic Indian Missions booth at the Mission Scenerama in Rochester War Memorial.  
The false faces are from the Fine Arts Department of the International Business-Machine Company.  
The masks were an indispensable part of the Iroquois nation's ceremonies. The Seneca Indians were one of the original five Iroquois nations which united into a United Nations of America, long before the arrival of white people.  
THE FALSE FACES were made with an elaborate mask making ceremony. When a tribe member dreamed he was to join the false face society he made it known to the leader and then set about to make his own false face.  
The preliminary carving of the false face is made in the trunk of a living basswood tree. A formal ceremony including invocations to the great spirit and the scattering of sacred Indian tobacco on a small fire pacified the tree and gave the mask healing power.  
The block containing the carved face was later painted and trimmed with hair to represent both the individual and the clan. Boaster or Old Crooked Nose was the founder of the false faces. In the battle over power with the Great Spirit he was said to do some seemingly miraculous tricks. He could not, however, move a mountain on request.  
Crooked nose and mouth of the masks denote the Boaster.
