AMONG WOMEN
About The Treasurer

Last week we considered the qualifications for an organization secretary and the duties of the secretary of an organization, and used "First on the Agenda," a handbook for voluntary agencies, and "Madame President" as our reference sources. In writing of the Treasurer, "First on the Agenda" states:

"The major role of the treasurer is custodial in relation to the finances of the agency. Specific functions include the following: the receiving of funds from whatever source or sources the agency draws its financial support; in accounting, through appropriate records for all funds received and disbursed by the treasury; the regular reporting through a formal 'Treasurer's report' of the exact financial status of the agency on given dates, carefully indicating balances or deficits; making available the agency's books for audit at prescribed intervals; the signing of all checks in the name of the agency, upon receipt of duly authorized vouchers.

"The treasurer is responsible for seeing that all books and financial records are kept in the agency under adequate safeguards.

OBVIOUSLY FOR the parish or interparochial activity, the word 'agency' should be deleted and the term 'organization' substituted.

Continuing the handbook points out: 'Qualifications for this office, too, are indicated by the functions to be carried. There should be some ease in dealing with figures and ability to interpret their meaning to board members.

"It is important to have in a treasurer a person with the imagination to look at figures in a ledger and translate them into services for people. Above all, it is essential to insure, through the treasurer, a responsible attitude toward and scrupulous carefulness in handling one of the most important custodial roles in the agency."

PARTICULARLY challenging, in my estimation, is the first sentence in the preceding paragraph. We have all had the misfortune of dealing with treasurers whose outlook is restricted to receipts and disbursements and who, in an attempt to keep the organization's finances as a responsible act.

In "Madame President" Estelle Spurrk declares: "All funds, special and otherwise should pass through the hands of the Treasurer. The exceptions to the rule are only the self-supporting projects such as library, pamphlets, or relief or sewing groups or greeting cards committee. These committees should handle all monies, order and pay for consignments and make an annual report."

UNDER REMARKS suitable at the time of installation of officers, Mrs. Spurrk lists the following: "The office of Treasurer is a very important one. The Treasurer receives all monies and disburses funds according to the rules of the organization. She should keep accurate, up-to-date records. The Treasurer must keep informed on the work of the organization and its financial needs so that she may explain it to others."

Then, with what amounts almost to unconscious humor, she suggests that the particular patroness of the Treasurer should be Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Since this is one of my own favorite titles of Our Lady I don't like to see it restricted to the Treasurer alone, but rather adopted by every member of the organization and particularly the officers.
