HOSE who have not been persecuted for their Faith; and those who have had little practical sympathy with persecttion, are apt to throw it off lightly saving "Every persecution purifies the Church. This remark was made concerning Poland and Hungary; and now it is repeated when it is learned that 8,500 of our foreign missionaries have been expelled from China, many after long tortune.

Persecution, as such, does not purify the Church anymore than a malady resulting from drunkenness purifies the body. As a discordered liver is not a healer of the physical body, so neither is persecution a purification of the Mysical Body. The Church in Constantino ple was not purified when the sainty John Chrysostom was exiled. Moslemism did not purify the Church in Africa; it destroyed it. The persecution in Japan in the seventeenth century did not purify the Church it allenced it. Persecution does make martyrs, but it also makes aposiles. It is true that our faults and our ains cars cause a persecution, but to attribute a positively good effect to an anti-God revolt, or the recrucifixion of Christ, is false.

The Church never prays for persecution; it prays for liberty to do God's work, Communism, which persecutes, does not seek to reorganize the world, but to recreate it or an anti-God basis. Therefore its terrorism carnot have a politively good effect anymore than cancer.
