N.D. Educator Slated In Lecture At Nazareth

First lecturer in Nazareth College Lecture Series will be the Rev. Astrik L. Gabriel, O. Praem., head of the Medical Institute at the University of Notre Dame. Father Gabriel will speak to the entire student body, the faculty and friends of the college Thursday afternoon, Oct. 27 at 2 p.m. on the education of women.

Canon Gabriel is a student of the Middle Ages, its education, its society, its learning, and its culture. During the past summer he presented papers to the Academie des Inscriptions et Belles Lettres, the Historical Society of Paris and the Catholic University of Paris. He has just borne from the World Congress of Historians at Rome. While abroad he also conferred with medieval scholars at Oxford and in London.

SUBJECT OF HIS LECTURE at the Catholic University of Paris was "Robert of Sorbonne," a secular priest who founded the College of the Sorbonne at the University of Paris. Father Gabriel lectured on "The Intellectual Life in Ave-

New St. Anthony Church Planned On Lorimer St.

Plans for a new St. Anthony Church building on Lorimer through to Montrose Street, four blocks north of the present church-school building at Lyell and Plymouth Avenues, were disclosed this week by the Rev. Michael J. Tydings, pastor.

Father Tydings explained that the proposed church building will be erected following construction of a new St. Anthony's School building, which is planned for occupancy next September. The school building will be erected just north of the proposed church site, opposite Jones Park, and will also contain an auditorium. Parishioners are now organizing a church-school fund appeal campaign, with a goal of \$150,000. General solicitation is scheduled Sunday, Oct. 30. Campaign workers will participate in a pep rally at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 27, in the present school hall.

HIS EXCELLENCY Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, will address the workers' kickoff dinner at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 29 in Lorenzo's Restaurant. General chairman of the campaign committee is Frank Ridotto. Co-chairmen include Salvatore DeBiase, John P. DiCesare, John DiGaetano and Joseph Flo. Other committee chairmen are Peter DeLucia, special gifts; Michael Bovenzi, survey; and Paschal Penna, Friends of St. Anthony. Campaign division leaders are:

The proposed church building will be of contemporary architecture. Father Tydings said, and will feature a high bell tower at one corner. The front will be of cast stone and ledge rock, to tie in with the proposed new parochial school. The church building will be of hinged frame, with wood roof decking to show texture under surfaces and to show off beams. The remainder of the deck will be of a slab roof or equal material. The narthex will be in flagstone. The present marble altar will be placed in the new church, against a back wall of oak louvers or marble. Sloped skylights will light the sanctuary. The church will include a choir loft and a basement hall.
