A wonderland of modern industry will be on display at Greater Rochester Industry on Parade at the Community War Memorial, Saturday, Oct. 29 through Sunday, Nov. 6. During this time, Rochester area manufacturing firms of all sizes and industries will demonstrate the products of their skills and technical achievements. Mayor Peter Barry of Rochester will officiate at the opening ceremonies, scheduled to be held at 2 p.m. on opening day. INDUSTRY ON PARADE is the largest industrial exhibit in the history of Rochester, and is the first such demonstration of the Greater Rochester area's industrial might held since the mid-1940s. Steel used in prefabricated buildings, pharmaceuticals, automotive equipment, dishwashers, optical instruments, industrial measuring instruments, the latest in check automation and hundreds of other sights normally reserved for those who work in these industries will be on display. For nine hours daily, starting at one o'clock in the afternoon and continuing until ten o'clock each evening, this product display of the industries in and around Rochester will be open to the public.
