Students of the two parochial schools sang the Mass at 9 a. m., on All Saints Day. DeSales High School students sang the Mass at 8 a. m. Friday.

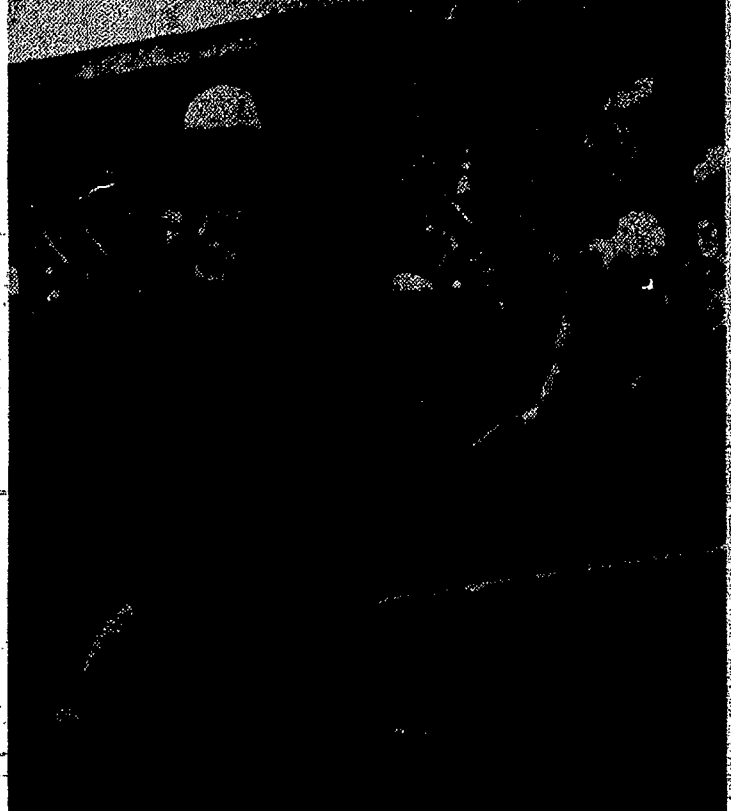
The local observance was in conjunction with the nation-wide program from Oct. 30-Nov. 6.

The week has been proclaimed by Pope Pius XII and endorsed by President Dwight D. Eisenhower and the Cardinals, Archbishops, and Bishops of the United States, as well as the governments of the states.

The specific aims in the Diocese of Rochester and in the city of Geneva are to encourage frequent reception of the Sacraments among youth and to pray for and encourage more religious vocations in this diocese and from the city of Geneva.

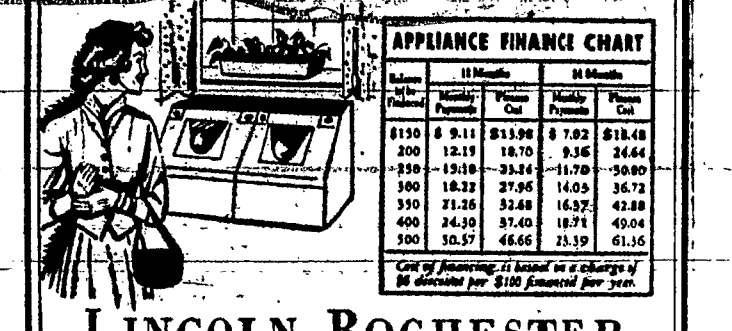

### 11th Annual High School Photographic Contest Sponsored By Eastman Kodak

A chance to exercise creative talents and gain national recognition and cash awards again is offered in the 11th Annual National High School Photographic Awards.

As one of the judges, the Rev. Michael F. Mullen, assistant professor, St. John University, Brooklyn, said: "In my capacity as a judge in last year's contest, I was considerably impressed by the number and the quality of entries submitted. I feel that photography can be an educational medium which affords the student an opportunity to develop his sense of beauty."

In expressing creative ability through photography, students who submit winning entries will share in a total of 256 prizes worth \$5,000. Sponsored by Eastman Kodak Company, this contest is open to all students in grades 9-12, in parochial, public, and private schools located in the United States and its territorial possessions.

JUDGING AND prizes will again be based on four classes: (1) school activities (including athletics); (2) people all-ages (excluding school pictures); (3) pictorials; and (4) animals and pets. First prize in each class is \$300 in cash, second and third selections receive \$200 and \$100 respectively. In addition, four special awards of \$50 each will be given, along with 240 honorable mention awards worth \$10 each.

The 1956 contest will run from Jan. 1 through March 31, 1956. A student may enter as many pictures in each class as he wishes, provided he is now in grades 9-12 and has taken the picture himself since April 1, 1955. Names of winners will be announced in May; and, as in previous years, a selection of the best of the winning entries will form a travelling salon-touring the nation's schools on free loan.
