St. Stephen School Drive Passes \$116,257 Total

Geneva — Subscriptions to the St. Stephen's School Building Fund reached a total of \$116,257 at the second report meeting of volunteer workers last Wednesday night. The meeting which was held in DeSales High School gym saw a figure of \$33,152 reported in pledges.

The Campaign, which has been in progress for the last five weeks is for a minimum goal of \$150,000. Proceeds of the drive are to be used to defray construction costs of a proposed new eight classroom school addition which will be located on Elmwood Ave.

GENERAL VOLUNTEER workers have held two meetings to date and have been responsible for bringing in approximately \$65,000 in pledges. In the opening stages of the campaign, an advance Memorial Gifts Committee reported \$31,000 in pledges.

Rev. Raymond F. Nolan, pastor of St. Stephen's announced the total at the meeting and congratulated the men for the "wonderful job" they are doing. Father Nolan reminded the men that there were still many families to be visited and that with the continued loyalty and enthusiasm of the workers, the minimum goal seemed well within reach.

College Lists Scholarships

Applications for scholarships to the College of New Rochelle must be filed before Dec. 1, according to an announcement received this week by Mrs. Robert L. Taylor, 52 Greenaway Road, chairman of the Rochester Chapter of the College of New Rochelle Alumnae Association.

Full tuition scholarships of \$2,000 are awarded for four years provided high standards of scholarship and conduct are maintained after admission to the college.

ART SCHOLARSHIPS of \$1,500 are open to students who wish to concentrate in art and who present a special art project in addition to other scholarship qualifications.

Also available are general scholarships varying in amount from \$600 to \$1,400. All candidates for scholarships must be high school seniors or graduates of approved secondary schools. They must have excellent records and the recommendation of the principal.

Awards are made on the basis of high school performance and the results of the January College Entrance Examination Aptitude Test, English Composition Test and two other achievement tests. These tests must be taken on Jan. 14, 1956. For further information, students should consult Mrs. Taylor or the Scholarship Committee, College of New Rochelle.
