

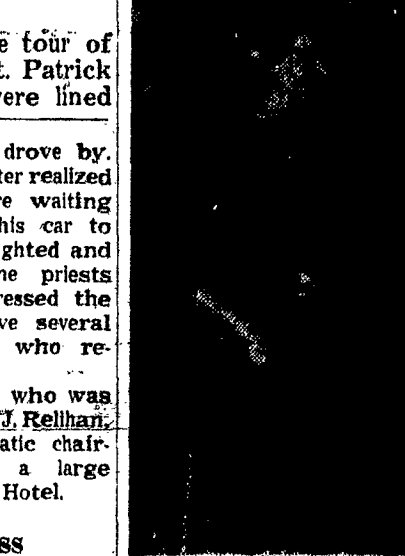

**College Lists Scholarships**  
Applications for scholarship to the College of New Rochelle must be filed before Dec. 1, according to an announcement received this week by Mrs. Robert L. Taylor, 52 Greenway Road, chairman of the Rochester Chapter of the College of New Rochelle Alumnae Association.  
Full tuition scholarships of \$2,000 are awarded for four years provided high standards of scholarship and conduct are maintained after admission to the college.  
ART SCHOLARSHIPS of \$1,500 are open to students who wish to concentrate in art and who present a special art project in addition to other scholarship qualifications.  
Also available are general scholarships varying in amount from \$600 to \$1,400. All candidates for scholarships must be high school seniors or graduates of approved secondary schools. They must have excellent records and the recommendation of the principal.  
Awards are made on the basis of high school performance and the results of the January College Entrance Examination Aptitude Test, English Composition Test and two other achievement tests. These tests must be taken on Jan. 14, 1956. For further information, students should consult Mrs. Taylor, or the Scholarship Committee, College of New Rochelle.
