

Eastern Rite Holy Name Men Plan Closed Retreat

Canada Church in Rome
Rome, (NC) — The Canadian National Church in Rome — the Church of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament and of the Canadian Martyrs — has received full canonical status as a parish with ceremonies in which His Eminence Clemente Cardinal Micara, Vicar of Rome, officiated.

Members of St. Josaphat's Holy Name Society received corporate Communion at the 9:00 a.m. Mass in St. Josaphat's (Byzantine-Slav Rite) Church, Rochester, on Sunday, Oct. 23. A Communion breakfast was held in the Parish School cafeteria. At the business meeting which followed, the annual election of Officers took place.

Formal installation of the newly elected Officers for the year, 1955-1956, will take place in St. Josaphat's Church on Sunday, Nov. 13 after the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

Officers to be installed are: Charles Bastuk, president; William Hryniv, vice president; William Tatyga, secretary and Michael Pukish, Jr., treasurer. The Rev. Nicholas Wolensky, pastor, is the society spiritual moderator.

PLANS ARE being formulated for the annual closed retreat to be made by the men of the parish at the Notre Dame Retreat House, 246 Alexander Street on November 25, 26 and 27.

Besides St. Josaphat's men, it is expected retreatants will come from St. Peter and Paul's Church, Auburn; St. Nicholas Church, Elmira Heights and St. John the Baptist Church, Syracuse.

Once again, the Rev. Clement C. Englert, C.S.S.R., native Rochesterian who teaches at Fordham University, will come from New York City to assist in the retreat. An authority in Eastern Rites, Father Englert will conduct conferences and celebrate the Holy Liturgy for the retreatants according to the Byzantine-Slav Rite.

By a special rescript of the Holy See, Father Englert has the rare privilege of being able to celebrate Holy Mass and administer the Sacraments in both the Latin and Byzantine Rites.

American Nuns Staff Japanese Shrine

Fukuoka, (NC) — Twelve American nuns will staff the first Shrine of Perpetual Adoration to be opened in Japan.

The nuns belong to the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration who staff St. Paul's Shrine in Cleveland, O.

Bishop Dominic Fukutani of Kukuoka has also announced that a retreat house and a Catholic information center will be built near the shrine.

The 12 Sisters will include not only cloistered nuns who will keep perpetual adoration, translate spiritual books and teach catechism at the grill, but also extern Sisters who will be engaged in active social and catechetical work.

Court Fight Looms To Remove Cross

Highland, Ill. (NC) — Protestant groups here have indicated they will take legal action to have a 20 foot crucifix erected by the Knights of Columbus removed from a public park because it is "a violation of the principle of separation of Church and State."

The Rev. Allan Roe of the Greater Hammond Ministerial Association one of the protesting groups, said "certain groups of citizens" would resort to court action unless the crucifix were removed voluntarily.

The crucifix was dedicated as a monument to veterans of all wars. The American Legion and the Boy and Girl Scouts helped the knights dedicate it.

Inscribed Picture Of Pope Presented To McQuaid High School By Bishop

A beautiful, framed picture of His Holiness Pope Pius XII with a special blessing and personal signature of the Pope was presented by His Excellency Bishop Kearney to McQuaid Jesuit High School on Friday morning, Oct. 28.

The Bishop celebrated Mass at the school that morning. The picture bore this inscription: "On this memorable day, when McQuaid Jesuit High School is dedicated to the honor of St. Francis Xavier we are happy to send to Our Venerable Brother, the Bishop of Rochester, and to all the members of his flock Our Apostolic Benediction, pledge of God's bounteous grace and token of Our paternal affection and joy for their enlightened and self-sacrificing devotion to the cause of Catholic education."

This special blessing was sent for the dedication of the school, but was delayed in transit. Bishop Kearney explained in a talk to the faculty and student body. Bishop Kearney pointed out that this special blessing exemplified the greatness of Pope Pius XII, who despite the burden of work with the pressing needs of souls in all parts of the world, took time to give his personal attention to the opening of this new school, erected by the contributions of the people of Rochester.

Friday also marked a double anniversary for Bishop Kearney, his birthday and his 23rd anniversary as Bishop. In honor of these anniversaries, Paul McGrath, President of the Senior Council of McQuaid Jesuit High School, presented the Bishop with a spiritual bouquet of Masses and Holy Communion offered for him by the 400 students.

Alterations are free. The store also features a large stock on display so that customers may compare various suits and colors.

A spokesman added that Stein's current modernization and expansion program is reflected in greatly improved appearance.
