Catholic Church In Cayuga County Topic In Auburn

Auburn—“The History of the Catholic Church in Cayuga County” was the topic of the talk by Edwin M. Nolan at the Communion breakfast of the Rosary Society and League of the Sacred Heart Sunday, Nov. 6 at the Osborne Hotel.

Introduced by the president, Mrs. William P. Foley, Nolan recalled that August 1956 will round out 300 years since the arrival of the Jesuit missionary Rev. Rene Menard into what is now Cayuga County. He reminded his hearers that in 1911 Auburn Council 207, Knights of Columbus, had erected at a point between Union Springs and Aurora a monument which commemorates the establishment of the “first house of Christian Worship” within the county boundaries.

In his talk Nolan discussed the research which has been carried on by ecclesiastical and lay historians in determining the site claimed to be the location of the first Mass said in August 1656 and sketched briefly the lives and times of the pioneer Catholics of the county.

Court Rochester, C. D. A. To Hold Annual Breakfast

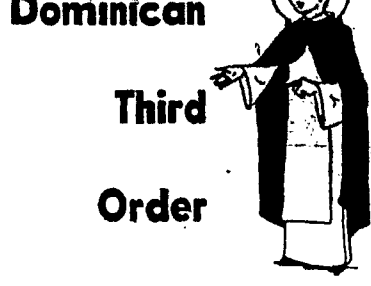
