

## Holy Redeemer Parish To Launch Memorial Campaign

Renovation of parish properties begun by the late Rt. Rev. Msgr. F. William Stauder, for 32 years pastor of Most Holy Redeemer Church, will be completed as a memorial to him. It was announced this week by the Rev. William J. Wahl, assistant pastor.



Monsignor Stauder, who died Oct. 26, before his last illness had inaugurated repair of all parish buildings and had planned a parish-wide fund-raising campaign to meet the repair costs. Parishioners will carry on the drive as a tribute to his long service among them. Father Wahl pointed out.

Goal of the campaign is \$100,000. Solicitation of parishioners will be conducted for a two-hour period on Sunday afternoon, Dec. 4. Several drive committees already have been organized.

## Franco Prays At Monserrat Shrine

Barcelona, Spain — (NC) — During his recent visit here, General Franco, Spanish Chief of State, knelt in prayer at the feet of the statue of Our Lady of Monserrat, one of Spain's most revered images of the Virgin which is generally known as the Black Madonna.

He was the guest of the Benedictine monks of the Abbey of Our Lady of Monserrat, which nestles high in the jagged mountains 30 miles from here. The whole community received him at the doors of the Basilica.

Afterwards, General Franco was accorded a solemn reception in the chapter room.

Numerous miracles have been reportedly wrought throughout the centuries through prayers offered before the Black Madonna of Monserrat. The monastery in which it is preserved was founded about 1,000 years ago and is famous as the spot where St. Ignace Loyola was inspired

## Russians Shop On Sunday, Old Folks Attend Church

Washington — (NC) — Although Moscow's Catholic church was "practically filled" for an early Sunday Mass, the congregation was made up largely of older persons, a U.S. Senator just back from a visit to the Soviet Union said here.

This absence of young people from churches was a recurrent theme in a statement issued here by Sen. J. Allen Frear, Jr., of Delaware. The legislator reported on personal visits he made to Moscow churches of four demon-

nations when services were in progress.

"Sunday in the Soviet Union is primarily a shopping day when all stores are open," he said. "It is also the day when some Russians go to church."

"The State teaches there is no God and since the State controls

the children, it is not difficult to imagine what is happening to the generations of young Russians now growing up behind the Iron Curtain," he said.

Sen. Frear's observations back up earlier reports of several other visitors to Russia. They noted the communist policy seems to be that older people are permitted to worship, while the youngsters are subjected to barrages of anti-religious propaganda aimed at keeping them out of the churches.

The hoped for result of this, it has been said, is that religion will gradually "die out."

## Supreme Court Bans Public Park Race Bars

Washington — (NC) — Racial segregation in public parks, playgrounds, golf courses and other recreational areas was voided by a decision of the U.S. Supreme Court. The nation's highest tribunal upheld a lower court decision which held that the doctrine of "separate but equal" facilities for white and Negroes was dead.

The highest court's ruling overturned other lower court decisions which held that the doctrine had not been swept away by the Supreme Court's ruling last year on the segregation question in the nation's public schools.

The action concerning the golf course originated in Atlanta and the Supreme Court ruled the Georgia city would have to adhere to its rule in a Maryland public parks and playgrounds decision. The Maryland case originated from protests by Negroes over segregation at Baltimore public beaches.

## Priests 2 Years In Red China Cells Back In U. S.

and freedom months later. "Who won the '53 and '54 World Series?"

Why two years of "arrest" for priests who had come to China to help the people? Communist hatred of religion was only part of the answer, both agreed.

"They hated us perhaps even more, because we were Americans, since America is the enemy that fought them in Korea and supports a threat against them on Formosa," Father Hyde said. "The charges against us reflected this — spying, war-mongering, listening to the Voice of America."

It was on September 11 that the Dominican pair, with Father Frederick Gordon, O.P., of Somerset, O., still in Hong Kong, recuperating from two operations, saw the last of their house-prison in Foochow. Their guards, all smiles and suddenly quite friendly, led them out that day to a new jeep and drove them to a final (though they did not know it) hearing before a Red magistrate.

The judge read off the list of familiar charges, and then he spun the priests with this totally unexpected clincher, "for which crimes you are hereby sentenced to be deported from China."

Not until they reached Canton, five days later, did the trio discover the reason for their impending freedom—that they were on the list of Americans whose release had been arranged

past suffering. Several times during their imprisonment, Chinese guards had hauled them off to sleepless grillings of 12 or more hours duration.

## Flood Victims Get Flood Aid

Cuttack, India — (NC) — Flood supplies received by three Indian dioceses from Catholic Relief Services—National Catholic Welfare Conference have been turned over for flood relief work.

It was learned here that the Dioceses of Cuttack, Sambalpur and Shillong, the three sees in the flood-hit area, have made available to government authorities for flood-relief operations thousands of pounds of food articles received from the American Catholic agency.

## Soviets Sponsor Atheist Contest

Berlin — (NC) — The Soviets have announced a competition for a "flashy" atheistic brochure, according to information, received here.

The top prize winners, according to the announcement, will receive 15,500 (\$3,500) 7,000 and 2,000 rubles, respectively. The brochure must not exceed 30 printed pages and must "prove the irreconcilability of science and religion."

## Bishops To Honor Apostolic Delegate

Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — Six cardinals will participate in a Solemn Pontifical Mass here on Nov. 17 marking the 50th anniversary of the ordination of Archbishop Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to

the United States. The Mass will be held in the chapel of Trinity College on the campus of Catholic University of America, where the American hierarchy will be holding its annual meeting.

More than 200 American archbishops and bishops are expected to march in procession to the chapel. The sermon will be preached by His Eminence, Cardinal Muench, Archbishop of Detroit.
