'Duchesne Day' Observed At Sacred Heart Academy

Guests of the Religious of the Sacred Heart at observance of Duchesne Day, yesterday, in the Academy of the Sacred Heart were members of the Alumnae and of the Parent's Association.

Sermon by the Rev. Henry A. Atwell, assistant editor, Catholic Courier-Journal was followed by Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Colored slides of the Centenary year were shown. Receiving with the Reverend Mother Odornie were Mrs. Charles Dennis, president of the Alumnae Association and Mrs. H. R. Drysdale, president of the Parent's Association. Miss Mary Ruth Home was chairman of Duchesne Day.

THE EXERCISES yesterday honored Blessed Rose Philippine Duchesne, a Religious of the Society of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and a "Pioneer Missionary of the New World," who was born at Grenoble, in France in 1769.

She became a novice at the Visitation Convent in Grenoble at the outbreak of the French Revolution. Soon afterwards the religious were expelled, the convent closed and the house became a prison.

In 1804 she met St. Madeleine Sophie and entered the newly formed Society of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In 1819 Philippine's request to go to the foreign missions was granted when Bishop Dubourg from New Orleans asked for recruits for his diocese. She then became the first missionary of the society.

The first Academy of the Sacred Heart was founded in 1818 at St. Charles, Mo., and gradually new foundations were made.

Philippine died in 1852 at the age of 83. Pope Pius XII numbered her among the Blessed in 1940.
