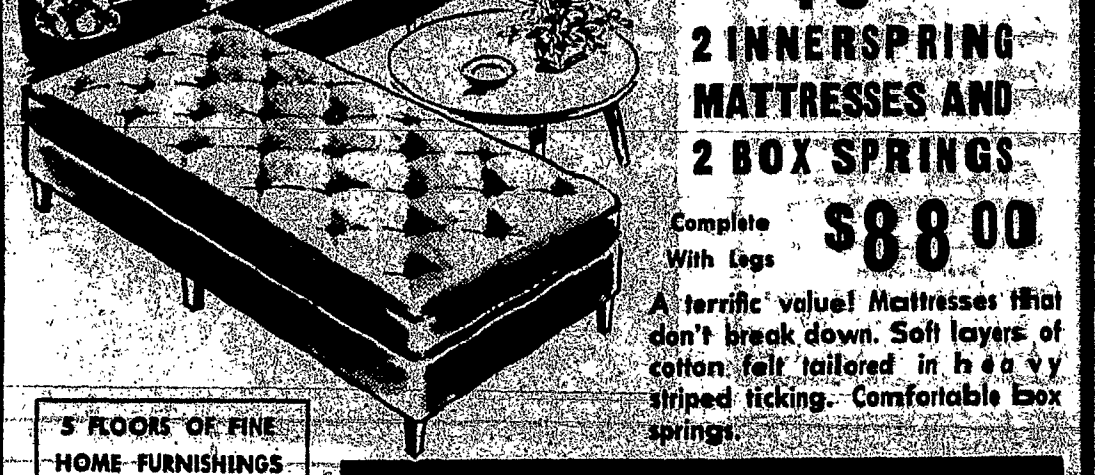
Quaint story book character dolls may be ordered for children's Christmas gifts. On Saturday, the 19th, home baked food will also be offered for sale.

University Marks 99th Anniversary

Niagara University, N.Y.—The Most Rev. Joseph A. Burke, bishop of the Diocese of Buffalo, will celebrate a Pontifical Mass, honoring the 99th Anniversary of the founding of Niagara University, Sunday, Nov. 20 at 10:30 a.m. in Alumni Chapel at the university.

The Mass will be the opening event of the day, which will be dedicated to Niagara's establishment in 1856, by the Most Rev. John J. Lynch, C.M., afterward, the first Archbishop of Toronto. The Rev. John J. Trainor, C.M., vice-rector of Our Lady of Angels' Seminary, will serve as assistant priest at the Mass and the Very Rev. Vincent T. Swords, C.M., university superior, and the Very Rev. Francis L. Meade, C.M., president, will be deacons of honor.

The Rev. Edward J. Kierman, C.M., vice-president of the university, will be deacon at the Mass and the Rev. Joseph A. McBride, C.M., dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, will be subdeacon. The Rev. Robert E. Murphy, secretary to the Bishop, will serve as master of ceremonies.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. John J. McMahon, diocesan director of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and Director of the Radio Control Board of the Buffalo Diocese, will deliver the sermon.
