New Book Outlines Men's Clubs Program

Washington—(NC)—The National Council of Catholic Men has a new publication, Projects, which has just come off the press and is being mailed to officers of councils and organizations affiliated with the NCCM.

Projects contains program suggestions for activities of the eight NCCM standing committees, which are the civic and social action, communications, family life, legislation, organization and development, public relations, religious activities and youth committees.

Projects answers a long-standing request from Catholic men of the nation for a regular program service, which would enable them to build their own program libraries.

Phil Finn, NCCM program director, is the editor of Projects, which will be published every two months, it was announced.

Special features include a particular color to identify the program of each committee, a standard eight-and-a-half by eleven inch page to facilitate filing, and a simple stapled binding for easy disassembly and distribution to committee chairmen.

Baptists Approve Watch-Dog For Parochial Schools Little Rock, Ark.—(RNS)—The Arkansas Baptist Convention, at its annual meeting here, voted to create a special committee "to determine and divide where tax money is used" for maintenance or support of parochial schools in the state.

The action was on a motion by the Rev. John Dodge, Hot Springs. It complemented earlier approval by the delegates of an executive board recommendation that Convention-affiliated Baptists do the following:

"Ask our state and national governments to prohibit any public tax money from being used to operate or to assist in the operation of religious work or religious institutions, or for the operation of vehicles used by religious institutions or churches or for the erection of buildings that are owned by churches or religious organizations.

Little Singers Of Paris Listed In Special Concert

The Little Singers of Paris (Les Petits Chantours a la Croix de Bois) France's most beloved boys' choir, will appear in a special concert of secular and religious music particularly appropriate to the approaching holiday season, on Tuesday, Nov. 29, at the Eastman Theatre.



On its sixth tour of the U. S., the 35-voice boys' choir under its director, Monsignor Fernand Mallet, is famous for the world over for its performances of great sacred music. This is of particular gratification to the Little Singers, for they were founded as the direct result of an appeal for an improvement in the quality of church music by Pope Pius in 1903.

Since then, the Little Singers have given over 10,000 concerts in over 40 countries, and have passed more than 1,000 graduates through its gates. It has been compared, in its organization, with our own, "Boys' Town" in Nebraska.

For the religious portion of their programs, the boys appear in white vestments known as albs, and wear wooden crosses around their necks.
