Seminarian Writes Article On Thanksgiving Custom

Mr. John J. Kenny, C.S.P., editor of the Paulist Feature Service, Washington, D.C., and son of Mr. and Mrs. John Kenny of East-Rochester, is the author of a current article titled "We owe God our Thanksgiving." The article is receiving national circulation through the Paulist Feature Service.

THE ARTICLE says in part: "Have you ever seen a faint smile appear on the face of a person when the word 'prayer' is mentioned? To many people prayer is nothing more than superstitious practice, a relic from medieval times. . . . Many think that devout people are childish and immature. . . . But this impression of prayer is only a caricature. Prayer is really the lifting of the mind and heart to God. All of us are completely dependent on God and the man who thinks he can stand alone is sadly mistaken.

"The pilgrims did not forget. Things were hard that first year . . . but they stayed. And they thanked God for helping them to stay. They set aside a special holiday each year for the express purpose of thanking God for everything He had given them.

"We Americans are the heirs to this beautiful custom. If we could fully penetrate the meaning of this holiday, then we would be filled with the unconquerable spirit of those early Americans, the spirit that has made America great and kept her free."

Lay Chaplain Corps Serves Men In Jail

Indianapolis, Ind. (NCI) - A campaign to increase membership in the "lay chaplain corps" which conducts the Catholic devotional services in Marion County Jail here.

Laymen lead prisoners in the Rosary and the reading of the Epistle and Gospel each Sunday. The unique apostolate came about because of a regulation forbidding clergymen to enter the jail except at the specific request of a prisoner.

Attendance at the service is voluntary and varies from 15 to 30 men each Sunday. After the service, prisoners are invited to take Rosaries, religious pamphlets and Catholic periodicals back to their cells. More than 100 Rosaries have been distributed in the last two years.
