Consideration of plans for a new church in Horseheads, opening of bids for building a new school in Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Elmira and starting work on an addition to Immaculate Conception School, Ithaca, all of development in the southern part of the Diocese of Rochester.

Ground was broken by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William Byrne, pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish, Ithaca for the addition to the school to provide four classrooms, an audio-visual room and a music room. Edward M. Lorscheider of Rochester is the architect.

Advent Candle

A tall white candle before a statue or picture of our Lady is a traditional Advent custom in many churches and homes.

Decorated with a white or blue ribbon, the candle flickers during night prayers and tells its story.

The candle represents Mary's pure body. The flame is a symbol of Christ, Light of the World, born of Mary.

One family used to paste a tiny Christ Child picture on the side of the candle as a way to show the children that Jesus lay close to Mary's Immaculate heart for many months before his birth. "This was the easiest way we knew," said the father, "how to explain to our little ones what was the meaning of blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus."

The Carmelite sisters at their convent on East Ave., Rochester, have designed beautiful candles which may be used during Advent and through the Christmas season.
