Miraculous Medal Feast Observed At Hospital

The chapel of St. Mary Hospital was filled to overflowing Sunday afternoon, when members of all organizations and their families were the invited guests of Sister Martina at a Mass honoring the feast of the Miraculous Medal.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney celebrated the Mass with Rev. Paul G. Wohrab, hospital chaplain, assisting.

The occasion was declared "a very happy one" for the Sisters of Charity, as it was through Blessed Catherine Labouré, a novice in their community, that the medal was given to mankind by Mary, the immaculate Queen of Heaven, in the chapel of the Mother house in Paris in the year 1830, just 125 years ago.

As a special privilege to the Community, a White Mass may always be said instead of the regular Purple Mass said in all Catholic churches during Advent.

BISHOP KEARNEY explained the significance of the medal and its effect on the lives of those who wear it. The medal was originally known as the Medal of the Immaculate Conception, but, because of the num-berless miracles attributed to its efficacy is now popularly known as the Miraculous Medal.

Music during the Mass was furnished by the student body of St. Mary School of Nursing. Miraculous medals were given to all attending.
