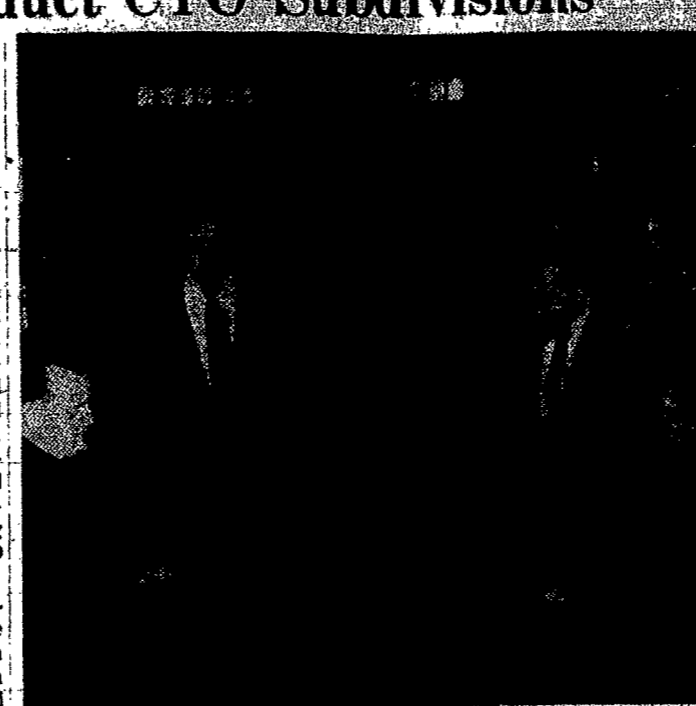
Holy Redeemer, Immaculate Conception Parishes Conduct CYO Subdivisions

Notre Dame Sister Speaks At University

Sister Mary Louis, S.S.N.D., daughter of Mrs. Louis A. Whalen, 520 East Ave., Rochester, and chairman of the department of chemistry at the College of Notre Dame of Maryland in Baltimore, spoke at a meeting of the Maryland section of the American Chemical Society at Johns Hopkins University on Nov. 18.

At the session on Chemical Education, Sister Mary Louis, a member of Sigma Xi, read a paper on "The Value of Undergraduate Chemical Research Projects in a Liberal Arts Program." Sister Mary Louis discussed the results obtained during three years of participation in the National Cooperative Undergraduate Research Program.

"SINCE THE initiation of the program, the College of Notre Dame of Maryland has achieved enviable recognition for the work of the senior chemistry participants. Annually they have received a certificate of merit for their work from the Chemical Handbook Publishers.

These students work in conjunction with those of other colleges on projects that are headed by industrial organizations.

In 1954 the seniors majoring in chemistry won the first prize at a regional meeting of student affiliated groups. At this meeting the student representatives presented reports on their work.

All of this work is under the direction of Sister Mary Louis. She is also moderator of the John J. Griffin Chemistry Club at the college. Sister Mary Louis has received high commendation for her own work in the field of chemistry.

Parish Census Being Taken At St. Stephen's

Geneva — A complete parish census is currently being conducted in St. Stephen Parish, Geneva. The census is expected to be completed Dec. 5.

Approximately 215 men are assisting in the census of more than 2000 homes in the parish area. The men are asking "Is there anyone living in this home who is a Catholic or was ever baptized a Catholic?"

IN EACH HOME where the answer is "yes" one or more questions will be left to be filled out by the person or persons who are being enumerated. Later, the census worker will return for sealed envelopes containing the replies.

"This is not the first time that a religious survey has been conducted here in Geneva," the Rev. Raymond P. Nolan, pastor, pointed out. "and I feel confident that the census workers will be received kindly by all our neighbors here in Geneva."

"After all," Father Nolan said, "the workers are not asking the people to which Church they belong — they are merely inquiring if any Catholics live in a particular home."

Sport-A-Month For Parishes Eyed By CYO

A new "sport-a-month" program to be offered to all youngsters in all parishes in Monroe County was announced by the Rev. Eugene H. McFarland, director of the Catholic Youth Organization sponsoring the program to be started in December.

To inaugurate this program, a boys and girls dodgeball tournament will be held on Wednesday, Dec. 28, in Columbus Civic Centre gymnasium.

THIS EXPANDED program again is a result of a successful membership drive just held and its intended purpose is to provide "recreational activities" for as many boys and girls possible in the parishes of Rochester and Monroe County.

Father McFarland also said that in order to accommodate this wide scope of programming, it is necessary for the C.Y.O. to obtain volunteer workers to assist with this expanded program.
