

### Most Maryknollers From New York

Maryknoll, N. Y. (NC) — New York has contributed more missionaries to Maryknoll than any other state in the nation, an annual check of personnel statistics at Maryknoll headquarters here has shown.

A total of 692 Maryknollers claim the Empire State as home, while Massachusetts comes in second with 406. There are now a total of 1,490 Maryknoll Fathers and 1,162 Maryknoll Sisters, the survey showed.

Only South Carolina and Wyoming among the 48 states are not represented in the Maryknollers.

### New Program At Niagara U. Starts In February

Niagara University, N. Y. — A new program designed to allow students entering Niagara University in February to complete their first year of college work the following September, was announced today by the Very Rev. Francis L. Meade, C.M., president.

According to Father Meade, students taking advantage of the new plan, may begin regular classes in February and by attending a 12-week summer course held especially for them, may begin their sophomore year at the end of the summer term.

The Rev. Joseph L. Boegel, C.M., registrar, explained that students beginning their collegiate work in February, might pursue any of the degree programs offered in the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business Administration or the School of Education.

He also said that the Reserve Officers' Training Corps unit at the university would conduct its regular course in basic military training during the summer, to allow an opportunity for the February enrollees to enter the advanced ROTC course at the end of their sophomore year.

He added that all the academic and athletic facilities of the university would be available to the half-year students during the summer.

### Promoted To Commander

Corning—The promotion of Dr. James Robert Dineen, formerly of Corning and a St. Mary Church parishioner, to the rank of commander in the U. S. The naval officer is now stationed at Camp Lejeune, N. C., following a tour of duty at Tripler General Hospital in Honolulu, Hawaii. Mrs. Dineen, a graduate nurse, is the former Miss Dorothy Segar, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Segar of Jamestown.

Commander Dineen received his medical degree from the University of Rochester medical School and served an internship given at Sampson Naval Base at the close of World War II. He served briefly as a physician at Annapolis with the Navy and began work in the field of orthopedic surgery at the Philadelphia Naval Hospital.

### Marquette League Appeals For Gifts To Make Indian Christmas A Merry One

The following appeal was received from the Marquette League for Indian Missions this week:

"When you cross a state border and enter Indian country, you step back a century in civilization. There are no electric lights, telephones or prosperous communities.

"In a few weeks parks and city streets in all the big and little towns in our rich land will bloom with Christmas trees and decorations. Big name charity organizations and church societies will broadcast invitations to Christmas tree parties and turkey dinners for one and all.

"Every child no matter how poor if he lives in or near a fair-sized community, may have a bit of Christmas. Christmas for all our First Americans.

"Big name charity organizations have no agencies in Indian reservations. There are no communities prosperous enough to take care of the needy ones. Some five years ago, Monsignor Cullen of the Marquette League for Catholic Indian Missions decided to do something about the situation. He begged for toys, dolls, books, games and new, more and more generous persons responded.

"In recent years the League has collected enough toys and dolls to send to most of the 150 Indian missions scattered through 28 of the 48 states. If you would like to join in Monsignor Cullen's Christmas giving send a toy doll or dollar to the Marquette League, 289 Fourth Avenue, New York 10, New York."

### College Plans Student Tour

Notre Dame, Ind. — St. Mary College, Notre Dame, will sponsor a student tour of Europe next summer. It was announced by Sister Maria Plet, C.S.C., college vice president who is organizing the trip.

First comprehensive tour to be planned by Saint Mary's for its students, the 1956 tour will encompass 66 days and include visits to principal shrines, art centers, and points of cultural interest in eight countries. Sailing date for 22 students and two chaperons is June 27 from New York.

High points of the tour are an anticipated audience with Pope Plus XII and a night at the opera during a seven-day stay in Rome; performance of the Salzburg Music Festival and the Memorial Theater in Stratford-on-Avon; visits to Fatima, Lourdes, and the LeMans, France, tomb of the Very Reverend Basil Anthony Moreau, C.S.C., founder of the Sisters of the Holy Cross who conduct Saint Mary's Fr. Moreau was officially approved as a candidate for beatification this summer.
