North Bay, Ont. — (NC) — Marie Dionne, of the world famous Quintuplets, is not as ill as first reports indicated. This assurance was given to Mrs. Olivia Dionne by Marie's doctor when Mrs. Dionne visited her 21-year-old daughter at the Hospital of St. Elizabeth in Montreal, where she was a patient.

It was also disclosed that Marie shortly will leave the hospital for her parents' home in Corbell, near North Bay.

### Spanish Bishop Condemns Writings

Madrid — (RNS) — The writings of Jose Ortega y Gasset, Spanish philosopher and critic who died here in October, were condemned as "dangerous to Spanish youth" by Auxiliary Bishop Francisco Miranda Vicente of Toledo.

Writing in the Roman Catholic publication "Los," Bishop Miranda recalled that Ortega was closely connected with the "atheistic and anti-Spanish republic of the popular front."

Bishop Miranda noted that while Sr. Ortega was reportedly reconciled to the Church just before his death, he never retracted his unorthodox views.

At the time of his death from cancer at the age of 73, Madrid's leading Catholic daily paper "La Vanguardia" reported the philosopher had died a Catholic after making his confession to Father Felix Garcia.

### Ancient Jews Role Seen Key To Knowing Faith

Washington — (NC) — Unless Christians recognize that it was for us that the children of Israel were chosen by God, they can never fully grasp what Communion of Saints means, Father John M. Oesterreicher declared here.

The director of the Institute of Jewish Studies at Saint Hall University is a convert from Judaism himself.

**FATHER Oesterreicher** declared: "Unless a Christian realizes God's providence for the Jewish people of old, the great, the infinite, the holy in bringing about our redemption — he or she loses the sense of wonderment, that sense of gratitude and continuity which are so much a part of a deep faith."

Of the ancient Jews, he said: "They were chosen not for any merit of their own, but out of sheer love. It was the sovereignty of this love, God's majestic freedom, that led to Abraham, that guided Isaac, Jacob and Joseph, that led to Moses and inspired the Prophets. And all this was done for the whole of mankind."

"It was all of us in mind that God chose the Israelites of old to be the custodians of His law, and He made them the nursery of Christ."

### Boise To Erect 60-Foot Cross

Boise, Idaho — (RNS) — A 60-foot stainless steel cross will be erected Christmas Day atop Table Rock, overlooking Boise. It was announced here by officials of the Junior Chamber of Commerce.

The project, which was endorsed by the Boise Ministerial Association.

The cross is planned not only as a focal point for Easter Sunday services but is a year-round religious symbol in constant view of all Boise residents.

### Vatican Prelates Mark Anniversaries

Vatican City — (NC) — Two outstanding and venerable members of the Vatican hierarchy who share between them 183 years of life and 137 years of service to the Church are celebrating major anniversaries this month.

They are His Eminence Alessandro Cardinal Verde, 90, Archbishop of the Basilica of St. Mary Major, and Archbishop Alfonso Cardinal, 93, secretary of the Sacred Congregation of Rites.

Cardinal Verde celebrates his 30th anniversary as a Cardinal December 14. Oldest of the 18 living Princes of the Church elevated by Pope Pius XI, he has been a member of the Roman curia under five Popes, beginning with Leo XIII.

Archbishop Cardinal is celebrating the tenth anniversary of his consecration as Bishop on December 15, and the 70th anniversary of his ordination four days later.

The government of Burma proposes to do away with a caste of beggars. This news fills us with alarm, we who are beggars of the Lord. But let us tell you first about the Burmese beggars who are known as the "Slaves of the Pagodas." In former times Burmese Kings would sentence some people to the care of the Pagodas; they were to receive nothing for guarding the places of worship, but were to live solely on alms. This "slavery" passed on from generation to generation until they became known as "Slaves of the Pagodas" or "genial beggars." The present Burmese government has now decided to release them from their slavery.

We have a "caste" in the United States known as the "Slaves of the Church"; it is made up of all Diocesan Directors of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. We have been "consecrated" by the sweet mystery of the King-of-Kings-to-live-by-begging for the 109,000 missionaries who serve the foreign missions in Africa, Asia, Oceania and elsewhere. All the alms we receive, we give to the Holy Father who has to support all mission societies in all parts of the world; we cannot keep a cent of the alms for ourselves, nor may we distribute any—even to missionaries. That privilege belongs solely to the Holy Father.

We love being beggars for the Vicar of Christ; we love being "Slaves of the Church"; we want no release from our tin cups; we want only the privilege of reaching the palm of our hand to you for a sacrifice that we may place it in the palm of the Holy Father. Would you turn us from your doors at Christmas time. There is not one of you who could not afford at least a dime; those who have more can afford more. Our Lord was a beggar for a stable at Christmas; may we be beggars at Christmas for an inn in Africa for the Lord Himself. Thanks.

### Baptist College Plans Negroes

Fresno, N. C. — (RNS) — Trustees of Chowan College, a Baptist school, voted unanimously last month to admit Negroes as students.

The North Carolina Baptist State Convention recently left \$5 up to trustees of Baptist schools and institutions to decide whether to admit Negroes.

Twenty-three members of the Chowan board of trustees attending a meeting here adopted a statement of policy on the question which reads:

"We believe in and teach the principles of the Christian home. Chowan students, therefore, must be of the social range to be accepted in the homes of our community. Therefore, the admissions committee shall not accept applications from the Negro race."

### Australian Labor Party Loses

Sydney, Australia — (NC) — The Labor Party, whose leader Herbert Evatt attacked two Catholic Bishops during the campaign, suffered a crushing defeat in Australia's parliamentary elections.

With returns about 80 per cent complete, the government coalition headed by the Liberal Party appeared to have won a 29-seat majority in the 122-seat House of Representatives.

Evatt himself narrowly averted personal defeat in the election in his constituency, winning by only about 1,000 votes.

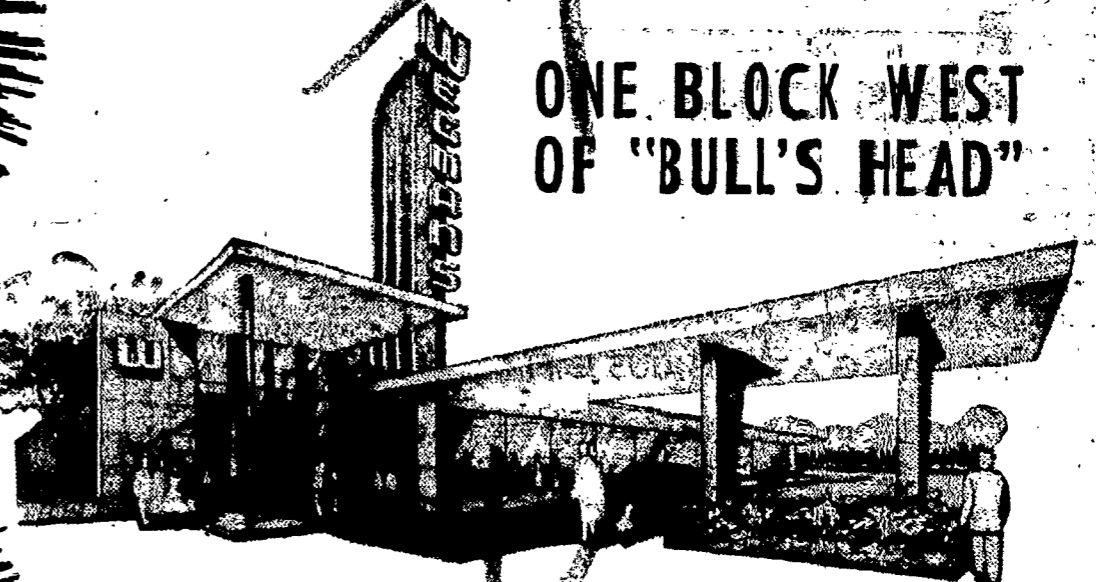
During the campaign Evatt criticized two prelates, Archbishop Gullford Young of Hobart and Bishop Andrew Tynan of Rockhampton, for allegedly trying to harm the Labor Party politically. The Bishops replied that they had only stressed the danger of communism to Australia from both within the country and abroad.
