Iron Curtain Nun Tells Of Red Terrorism

Washington, D. C .- (RNS) - A story of the privations, persecutions and hardships suffered by Roman Catholic religious in Romania was disclosed here by a former Ursiline nun from that Communist satellite country who reached freedom through the help of her sister, an American nun of the Holy Cross order.

"Miss Anna Walischkowski, 62, was given formal release. from her religious vows in 1949 when life became impossible for nuns in Romania. In 1952 she managed, by means which must be kept secret, to flee across the Iron Curtain and make her way to a refugee comp in Germany.

She was reunited here with her sister, who is Sister Mary Freda of the Academy of the Cross. They had not seen each other since parting in their native city, of Danzig, Germany, 40 years ago.




