A. F. Siudara's Rites Conducted, Father Of Priest

Funeral services for Andrew F. Siudara, father of the Rev. Matthew A. Siudara, assistant pastor of St. Stanislaus Church, were held at the home, 45 Rogers Parkway, and in St. Stanislaus Church, Thursday, Dec. 22.

Mr. Siudara, 69, died at home Dec. 18, 1953. Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by Father Siudara, assisted by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph A. Balcerak, deacon, the Rev. Anthony Mycek, Schenectady, subdeacon, and the Rev. Mr. Edward Walda, of St. Bonaventure Seminary, master of ceremonies.
