

### Mass Marks Silver Jubilee Of Church Dedication

Auburn — Solemn High Mass in the presence of His Excellency, Bishop Walter A. Porey of Syracuse on Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. marked the Silver Jubilee of the dedication of St. Alphonsus Church, Auburn.

The sermon in commemoration of the 25th anniversary of the present St. Alphonsus edifice was preached by the Rev. Geoffrey E. Stone, C.S.S.R. of New York City. The parish was founded by Redemptorist Fathers.

The Mass was offered for the repose of the soul of the late Rt. Rev. Msgr. William F. Bergan, P.A., a native of Auburn, pastor of St. Monica Church, Rochester and Chancellor of the Diocese.

THE ANNIVERSARY MASS was celebrated by the Rev. John B. Kleintjes assisted by the Rev. Jerome Holubowicz, O.F.M. Conv., Deacon; the Rev. John B. Crowley, Subdeacon; the Rev. C. Richard Nagle, First Master; the Rev. Robert Dobbertin, second Master.

The Very Rev. Frederick G. Straub, V.F., pastor of the church, announced the purchase of the property where the church now stands on Nov. 3, 1929, and work started on the new edifice on Dec. 1 of that year.

### 16th Year Of Family Communion Set In Diocese, Practice Spreads

N.A.W.C. News Service—Evidence has been accumulating rapidly in recent weeks at headquarters of the Family Life Bureau, National Catholic Welfare Conference, that the coming Feast of the Holy Family will be observed more widely as a family feast than in any previous year.

"This is further indication," Father Edgar Schmiedeler, O.S.B., bureau director, said, "of the genuine vitality of our family life movement which has been developing over the past quarter-century."

THE FEAST of the Holy Family falls on the Sunday within the octave of Epiphany. The date for 1956 is January 8.

"The remarkable growth of the feast's family observances has been all the more surprising," Father Schmiedeler continued, "because when it was first proposed some 20 years ago to emphasize the feast more as a family feast, many felt nothing would come of the recommendation. As they said, the feast came too close to Christmas. Actually the striking family spirit of the Christmas season seems to have encouraged it. The Christmas season has always been a family season."

Among religious observances of the Feast of the Holy Family that have especially enjoyed popularity are family group devotions at Mass, family group Communion, and the family Holy Hour.

IN THE DIOCESE of Rochester, for instance, where the practices of family Mass and family Communion will be observed for the 16th successive year on January 8, Bishop James E. Kearney has written to his faithful:

"Let all attend Mass as family units, sons and daughters led to altar by father and mother, and parents in turn led by the devotion of their little ones to the altar of God."

Referring to the "miracles of divine grace attendant upon this practice," Bishop Kearney continued: "In a world where even nations find existence precarious, the family unit must more and more develop into the great stabilizing force God meant it to be. Fashions and popular idols so often betray even the basic ideals of Christian behavior that our homes must become fortresses of virtue and strength, not just for the children but for the parents as well."

Vatican City—(NC)—Two German statesmen, a national soccer team, and sportswriters were received last week by His Holiness Pope Pius XII in separate audiences.

Heading the list was Heinrich Von Brentano, Foreign Minister of the German Federal Republic who is in Rome to spend Christmas with his brother Clemens, German Ambassador to Italy.

THE HOLY FATHER also received Anto Stork, who is Minister of Labor in the Adenauer cabinet.

The Pontiff received a group of German sportswriters and radio and television technicians who came to Rome to cover the international German-Italian soccer match. Finally the Pope received the German national soccer team, which lost to the Italians, two goals to one.

Receiving the sportswriters and the soccer team, the Pope gave brief addresses discussing the higher aims of sports activities and international contests like the Italian-German game which was held on Dec. 15.
