Tokyo - (RNS) - Francis Cardinal Speliman, Archbish-op of New York, laid the cornerstone here of Japan's first church to be dedicated to St. Patrick and donated \$5,000 to its building fund.

Describing himself as "the parish priest of a sister parish of St. Patrick," the cardinal expressed hope that "the same blessings which have come to our church through the intercession of St. Patrick may come to this parish here in Tokyo."

Cardinal Spellman stopped off in Tokyo on his fifth con-secutive Christmas visit to American servicemen in the Far East.

Last December, on a similar trip, he blessed the cornerstone of St. Patrick's church in Seoul, Korea, which is planned as a small counterpart of New York's St. Patrick's Cathedral. He also gave \$5,000 to the prioris of St. Columban's Foreign Missionary Society who will staff it.

After the cornerstone mony here, the cardinal flew by helicopter to Camp Scalinsome **600** men in the U.S. Cavalry Division, which he first met in 1945 when the unit helped liberate the Philippines.
